Naples, July 19.

ON the 16th Instant at Night Admiral Byng sailed from hence in the Bar fleur, with the Rupert, for Cagliari in Sardinia. On the 17th came in an English Transport in six Days from Palermo, the Master reports, that the Convoy and Transports with the Piemontese Troops sailed from thence on the 9th for Sardinia, where it is reckoned the Count d'Ottaviano, the Emperour's Minister, is by this time arrived, in order to receive the Possession of that Island from the King of Spain's Captain General there, and to deliver it to the Commander in chief of the King of Sardinia's Forces: When Admiral Byng has seen that done, he designs to return to Italy, and go to Hanover.

Madrid, July 29. The King has accepted of Cambray for the Place of Congress, which is to be opened on the 15th of October next, and named his Plenipotentiaries, who are the Conde de St. Isevan Marquess de las Navas the first, and the Marquess de Beretti Landi the second; the Marquess de Mejorada who was at first appointed, having excused himself upon Account of his bad Health. Sig. de Pozzobueno has taken his Leave of the King at the Escorial, and will be here To-Morrow; he will stay only two or three Days, and then set out for Bilbao, where he intends to embark for Holland, and from thence to pursue his Journey to Hanover with all possible Expedition. He carries with him the Cedula for the annual Ship, and also the King of Spain's Renunciation in order to exchange it against that of the Emperour. He takes with him as Secretary of the Embassy Sig. Spel tta. A Project for erecting a trading Company, exclusive of others, which has been proposed to this Court by a Dutchman, having been examined by a Junta of Ministers, the King upon their Report has rejected it.

Stockholm, July 23. Tho' the States of this Kingdom separated on the 12th Instant, the Matters concluded during this Session are not yet made publick. The King set out the same Evening with the Prince of Hesse his Brother, to take a View of the Troops encamped about Gasse, from whence his Majesty proceeded towards the Copper and Silver Mines, and is not yet returned. The States have left his Majesty at Liberty to go out of the Kingdom, if his Majesty and the Senate judge it for the publick Good. On the 17th Instant an Adjutant-General called March returned hither from Petersbourg, with Letters from the Czar in Answer to those he carried, notifying the

present King's Accession to the Throne; but they will not be opened before his Majesty comes back. M. Burmanis, Ambassadour of the States General, having for some Time past been so indisposed as to be incapable of Business, received last Week his Letters of Revocation. The Wind being come Northerly To-Day, we expect to hear To Morrow that the Men of War which have been detained by contrary Winds at the Dahlers, have put to Sea.
