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Madrid, September 16.

THE Marquess de Lede made but one Day's Stay at the Escorial, to give the King an Account of the Condition of the Forces he had brought from Sicily, and to receive from his Majesty, as a Mark of his favourable Acceptance of his Services, the Honour of a Grandee of Spain; and then hastened hither, where he had Conferences two Days successively with the Secretary at War; and on the 12th Instant very early in the Morning, set out for Cadiz with all Diligence, the Expedition against Africa being designed to be put in Execution the Beginning of next Month. Sig. Patinno is to have the Direction of this Expedition, in the Manner he was employed on those to Sardinia and Sicily; and for that end is to set out for Cadiz To Morrow. The List of the General Officers who are to serve in it is not yet made publick, but they are said to be such as the Marquess de Lede chose to recommend to the King. The Conduct of Don Antonio Castaneta, who commanded the Fleet in the Year 1718, having been newly examined and approved by the Court, his Majesty has honoured him with the Commission of Lieutenant-General of the Marine, and declared that he shall hold with it that of General of the Artillery also, which he obtained in the Year 1708, with the full Appointments of both. The Conde de St. Estevo, his Majesty's Plenipotentiary for the Congress at Cambray, has fixed the 20th Instant for his Departure from hence on his Journey thither.

Brussels, Oct. 2. Yesterday being the Anniversary of the Emperour's Birth-Day, *Te Deum* was sung on that Occasion in the Cathedral of St. Gedula, all the Garrison being drawn up in the Park gave a triple Salvo, the Cannon on our Ramparts were thrice discharged, and all other usual Demonstrations of publick Joy were shewn. The Marquess de Prié being absent at Aix la Chapelle, the Field Marshal Vehlen gave a splendid Entertainment to the principal Officers of the Garrison and to several Ladies; and General Wrangel treated the chief Persons of Quality of both Sexes at this Court. It is not yet known when the Marquis de Prié will return hither; in the mean time the Government have taken the necessary Precautions for preventing the bringing of the Plague into these Provinces from Marseilles: Orders have been sent to the Governours and Magistrates of the Towns of Ostend and Newport, not to admit into those Ports any Ships that shall come from the Coasts of France or other suspected Places; but to oblige them to lie off at a Distance from the Shore till the Masters give to the Officers appointed to visit them such Accounts as may satisfy the said Governours and Magistrates that they may be admitted without Danger. Orders are also given to the Director General of the Posts of these Countries, to cause all the Letters which shall come from France to the several Offices, to be carefully perused before they are distributed.

Paris, Oct. 2. The King's Declaration for establishing a Chamber of Justice, during the

Vacation of the Parliament, passed the Seals the 29th of September: It is composed of several Counsellours of State and Masters of Request, without admitting into it any Member of the Parliament. M. d'Armenonville, Secretary of State, is appointed President of this Chamber, which is to be assembled in the Great Hall of the Augustin Fryars, where the Assemblies of the Clergy are usually held; it is believed that the Advocates of the Parliament will refuse to plead before this new Judicatory, and that they will be obliged to substitute in their Room those of the Grand Council. The Doctors of the Sorbonne had Yesterday being the first of the Month their usual Meeting, at which it was expected the Chancellour would have been present, in order to have proposed the accepting the King's late Declaration upon the Pope's Constitution; but great Opposition on the Part of the Doctors being apprehended, the Proposal of that Affair has been put off to some other Meeting. The Faculty of Physicians of the University of Paris has been twice assembled upon a Letter from the Abbess de Chelles the Regent's Daughter, who has recommended her Physician's Son to be admitted to the Degree of Doctor in that Faculty, which they have accordingly granted. An Edict is published, declaring, that for the future no Gold or Silver Money shall be coined at the Mint but with a certain Mark, and according to the Standard described by this Edict; that all the old Species except one or two particular Coinages, shall be brought to the Mint to be re-coined; and that the excepted Species shall be brought there likewise to have a certain Stamp or Mark put on them, in the same manner as the new Coin; that all foreign Coins shall be brought to the Mint; that to the several Sums of Gold and Silver brought in, an equal Sum of Bills of 100, 50, or 10 Livres shall be added, and the Amount of the whole shall be paid in the new Coin, that is for 1000 Livres in Gold or Silver and another 1000 in Paper, 2000 shall be given in the new Coin, the intrinsic Value of which will little more than answer the 1000 Livres in the old Coin; and that after the 1st of December next, the old Species shall be abolished intirely, and not be negotiated in any manner whatever, but shall be confiscated if found in the Possession or Custody of any Persons, or Communities without Exception, one half to the King, the other half to the Informer. All former Arrêts or Declarations concerning the Exportation of Gold and Silver, in Coin or in Bullion, are renewed and enforced; and Subjects or Foreigners who export any Gold or Silver, (except only a small Quantity of the new Coin) are to be punished with Death, a Fine of 6000 Livres, and Forfeiture of Ships, Waggon, or other Carriages made Use of for that Purpose.
