Westminster, January 25.

HIS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in his Royal Robes seated on the Throne, with the usual Solemnity, Sir William Sanderfon, Gentleman-Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for restraining the Sub-Governour, Deputy-Governour, Directors, Treasurer or Cashier, Deputy-Cashier and Accountant of the South-Sea Company, from going out of this Kingdom for the space of one Year, and until the End of the then next Session of Parliament, and for discovering their Estates and Effects, and for preventing the Transporting or Alienating the same.

An Act to disable the present Sub-Governour, Deputy-Governour, and Directors of the South-Sea Company, at, from and after the respective Times for electing a Sub-Governour, and Deputy-Governour, and new Directors of the said Company, to take, hold, or enjoy any Office, Place, or Employment in the said Company, or in the East-India Company, or Bank of England, and from voting upon Elections in the said Companies.

An Act for repealing an Act made in the Ninth Year of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, Intituled, An Act to oblige Ships coming from Places Infected, more effectually to perform their Quarentine; and for the better preventing the Plague being brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain, or Ireland, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, and to hinder the spreading of Infection.

And to one private Bill.

Malaga, Dec. 31. The Marquês de Lede has sent hither for a considerable Quantity of Lime and a great Number of Bricks, which are providing accordingly; and several thousand Pioneers will speedily be sent over, who 'tis said are to be employed in levelling all the Works made by the Moors while they besieged Ceuta, and in raising additional Fortifications to that Place. The Regiment of Almanza was shipped off here, and sailed for Ceuta on the 26th Instant.

Turin, Jan. 22, N. S. On the 7th Instant in the Morning Mr. Moleworth, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, had a private Audience of the King of Sardinia, and in the Evening was admitted to an Audience of the Queen and Madame Royale. On the 20th his Majesty went to take the Air at la Venerie, where having dined he returned hither in the Evening. The Marquês of Villa Clara, Deputy from the Island of Sardinia, is arrived here, to congratulate the King on his Accession to that Crown, and to assure him of the Fidelity of his new Subjects.

Berlin, Jan. 25. The King of Prussia in his late Journey to Stetin took a Resolution to establish a French Colony there, and to give them considerable Privileges, for improving the Trade of that Town: His Prussian Majesty went to Potsdam on the 22d Instant, and is expected back the 6th or 7th of next Month. Yesterday was the Prince Royal's Birth-day, when he entered into his 10th Year. The third Payment to the Crown of Sweden, for the Cession of Stetin, is now intirely made, in the Manner stipulated by the Treaty.

Navy-Office, Jan. 25, 1720.
