DESIGNATION OF STOKE TOWN CONSERVATION AREA

Notice is hereby given that, on 5 February 2010, the Council of the City of Stoke-on-Trent ("the Council") resolved that certain areas of the City namely part of Stoke Town Church Street, Spode and the Georgian Buildings on Liverpool Road, Stoke-on-Trent be designated as the Stoke Town Conservation Area pursuant to section 69 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.
