Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames PROPOSED WAITING RESTRICTIONS (SURBITON) (ALPHA ROAD, ELLERTON ROAD AREA AND PINE GARDENS)

THE KINGSTON UPON THAMES (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (AMENDMENT NO. *) TRAFFIC ORDER 200*

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames propose to make the above Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

2. The general effect of the Order would be as follows: -

ALPHA ROAD, SURBITON to lengthen double yellow line "at any time" waiting restrictions by approximately 4 metres opposite No. 53;

to introduce double yellow line "at any time" waiting restrictions at the junctions below;

BOND ROAD, SURBITON at the sides of Nos. 25 and 27, Tolworth Park Road (for 7.5 metres); on both sides of its junction with Thornhill Road (for 7.5 metres);

DENNAN ROAD, SURBITON outside No. 1 Dinnan Road and at the side of No. 78 Ellerton Road (for 6 metres);

DITTON ROAD, SURBITON opposite Nos. 6 to 10;

ELLERTON ROAD, SURBITON in the north-west to south-east arm of Ellerton Road, at its junctions with Ditton Road and the north-east to south-west arm of Ellerton Road (for between 3 and 10 metres);

outside and to the north of No. 2 Ellerton Road (for 23 metres);

opposite Nos. 4 to 12;

outside No. 78 Ellerton Road and at the side of No. 1 Dinnan Road (for 6 metres);

THORNHILL ROAD, SURBITON opposite Nos. 120 to 124;

TOLWORTH PARK ROAD, SURBITON Outside Nos. 25 and 27;

PINE GARDENS, SURBITON outside and at the side of Nos. 35 and 64 (for between 12 and 18 metres);

CROWN DALE, GIPSY ROAD, LANSDOWNE HILL AND LEIGHAM COURT ROAD - LOADING PLACE AND SHORT- STAY PARKING PLACES

(Note: This notice is about the conversion of a loading place in Leigham Court Road into a short-stay parking place, the lengthening of short-stay parking places in Crown Dale and Lansdowne Hill and the formalising of short-stay parking places in Gipsy Road.)

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Lambeth Borough Council on 23rd April 2010 made the Lambeth (Free Parking Places) (Limited Time) (No. 4) Order 2010 and the Lambeth (Loading Place) (Revocation No. 1) Order 2010, under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Orders will come into force on 3rd May 2010.

2. The general effect of the Orders will be to:

- convert the loading place on the north-east side of Leigham Court Road, outside St Peter's Church, into a free, short-stay parking place;
- lengthen the existing free, short-stay parking place on the north side of Lansdowne Hill, near its junction with Norwood Road, by 35 metres in a westerly direction and lengthen the one situated opposite (on the south side of Lansdowne Hill) by 12 metres in a westerly direction;
- lengthen the existing free, short-stay parking place on the north side of Crown Dale opposite Crown Point Parade by 5 metres in an easterly direction;
- formalise the existing free, short-stay parking places on both sides of Gipsy Road, between Hamilton Road and Paxton Place, by including them into an Order.

3. The short stay parking places referred to above will operate from 7am to 7pm on Mondays to Saturdays (excluding Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays) and during this time vehicles may be parked in them free of charge for periods of up to 30 minutes at a time, with no return to the parking place within 2 hours of leaving it.

4. The Orders are necessary to provide improved parking facilities for residents, visitors, and businesses and their customers.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
