Stockholm, March 15, O. S.

N the 9th Instant the King of Sweden went to a Seat called Swarta about 20 Leagues from hence, where his Majesty met the Prince his Brother, and the 10th in the Evening they came together to this City. The next Morning the Prince was complimented by the Senators, foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, on his Arrival. On the 11th Count Freytag, the Imperial Envoy, set out for Copenhagen. This Morning Count Lilliested and Baron Strumfield set out for Grislehaven, whence they propose to pass over to Ahland, and thence to Finland, in order to open the Conferences which it has been agreed to hold at Neustat with the Mus-covite Plenipotentiaries. The King having lately appointed a Commission of Members of the Ghancery, not only to inquire into the Conduct of M. Hopken, late Resident from this Crown at the Court of Vienna, but also to pass such a Sentence in the Case as they shall find agreeable to Justice and the Laws of the Kingdom; those Commissioners, of whom Count Banier is President of Victorian for the Case for the control of the Commissioners. dens fat Yesterday for the first time.

Stockholm, March 22, O. S. On the 20th Instant a Muscovite Officer, who came round the Bothnick Gulph, arrived here from Petersbourg: It is faid he was but 16 Days on the Way, and has brought a Letter from General Bruce for Count Lilliested, to acquaint him that the said General and his Colleague, as Plenipotentiaries from the Czar, were on their Departure for Neustat, and therefore defired the Swedish Plenipotentiaries would also hasten their Journey thither; where-upon an Express was immediately sent to Count Lilliested and Baron Strumfield, who were then at Grissehaven, with Orders to proceed on their Journey with all Diligence. Yesterday the King, Queen and Prince of Hesse dined at Ulrichsdahl, a Place about a League from hence, and returned to Town in the Evening. This Morning the King and Prince fet out for Upsal, whence his Majesty defigns to proceed to Gafle, to view the feveral Difpositions that have during the Winter been made in the Neighbourhood of that Place, to oppose the Muscovites in case they should attempt this Year to land thereabouts. General Hamilton accompanies the King, he being this Year again appointed to command the Body of Troops which are to defend that Part of the Country.

Paris, April 12. M. Fagon, Trudaine, Machault, and Ferrant, are named Commissioners to examine the Accompts of the India Company, and to make an Inventory of all their Effects. And eight Perfons are appointed, in whose Hands the said Effects are to be sequestered in the King's Name, till a new Company be formed. The Arrêt which declares the old Company Bankrupt, is in the Press, and 'tis expected will be published To-Morrow. That Arrêt is to be followed by another for erecting a new Company to carry on the Trade, of which 'tis said Mess. Paris will have the chief Direction. On the 10th Instant the King performed the usual Ceremony of washing the Feet of 12 Poor, whom he served afterwards at Table, the Dishes being carried up by the Duke Regent, the Duke of Chartres, and the rest of the Princes the Accompts of the India Company, and to make the Duke of Chartres, and the rest of the Princes of the Blood. After which the King went in Ceremony to hear Mass at the Church of the Capuchins in the Street St. Honoré; the Feuillans, to whose Church he used formerly to go, having

incurred his Majesty's Displeasure, on account of their having renewed their Appeal from the Pope's Constitution. Four new Corps de Garde are established in this City, for the better preventing all Disorders. The Duke Regent has given Orders to Mess. Paris, to send two Millions given Orders to Mess. Paris, to lend two Millions of Livres in Specie into Provence, for the Relief of such Places as are yet infected with the Plague; and Directions are likewise given to the Intendants of the neighbouring Provinces, to surnish them with all sorts of Provisions.
