THE HAMMERSMITH AND FULHAM (BUS LANE) (CONSOLIDATION) (AMENDMENT NO. 2) ORDER 2010

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 25th of June 2010 the Council of the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham made the above named Order under section 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended.
