Stockholm, April 12. HE Plenipotentiaries who on the Part of this Crown are to manage the Conferences at Neustadt, are most pro-bably still at Grissehaven, the Letters which are come in from thence having left them there on the 10th Inftant. They had been once out at Sea, and were got within Sight of the Isle of Ahland, but met with so much Ice that they were forced to come back. On the 6th Instant Major General Cronberg's Regiment of Foot came hither, and To-Morrow the King deligns to review four Regiments now here, which are to be drawn up in the Park near this Place. The Inhabitants of this City being extremely incom-moded by having fo many Men quartered upon them already, the King has ordered that most of the other Regiments which are on the March hither shall halt in proper Places, so as they may not arrive here be-fore the necessary Dispositions are made for all to incamp in this Neighbourhood: And it is said, that two or three Regiments that were at first designed to be part of the Army which is to cover this City, are now ordered to march towards Calmar, in the Neighbourhood of which Place there will

also be posted a Body of about 5000 Men under the Command of General Ornstedt.

Stockholm, April 19. The 17th Instant being the King of Sweden's Birthday, their Majestics received upon that Occasion the Complements of the Senators, Nobility, and Foreign Ministers, and in the Evening there was a Ball at Court. The same Day M. de Campredon, who arrived here from Petersbourg the Night before, made his Report to their Majesties of his Negotiations.

Paris, May 14. On the 10th Instant there was a Ball at the Tuilleries, but His Majefly did not dance as he formerly used to do. The Turkish Ambassadour was present there, with all his Retinue. A fatal Accident hap pened before the Ball began, to the Cheva lier de Fenelon, Nephew to the late Archbishop of Cambray, and Lieutenant of the Regiment of French Guards. This Gentleman attempting to leap over the Ballisters which separate the King and the Officers of the Court from the Rest of the Company, his Foot slipt, and he fell on one of the Spikes, which entering into his Thigh cut the great Vein, of which he died two Hours after. M. d'Argenson, late Keeper of the Seals, was interred on the 10th Instant with great Pomp. The King has granted a Pension of 6000 Livres to each of his two Sons, and to Madam Collandre his Daughter 4000 Livres, besides the Employment of Chancellour of the Order of St. Louis which his Majesty continues to his eldest Son. The Duke of Chartres was declared on the 11th Collonel-General of the Infantry, except the French Guards and the Swife Troops, which remain under their former Commanders. This Post was suppressed by King Lewis the 13th, upon a Notion of its giving too much Authority to a private Man, and the last Collonel General was the Duke of Epernon. The Duke of Chartres,

who holds this Employment by a Brevet only, will have no Sallary, nor all the Prerogatives which those who were formerly in that Post enjoyed. The Marquels de Biron will continue Inspector-General of the Infantry, and have a great Share in the Manage-ment of Affairs under the new Collonel-General. The Wife of Mr. Law, late Comptroller General, has left the Hôtel de Mazarin, of which the Duke of that Name has taken Possession again, and on the 10th all her Effects were serz'd by Order of the King. Mr. William Law continues still in the Bastile.

Hague, May 13. M. Somersdyck sailed from the Texel on the 10th Instant, with four Men of War, for the Mediterranean; the reit of the Squadron appointed for that Service are to follow and join him at Cadiz. M. Delmet, who had been General Receiver of the States General, died last Night. Letters from Warsaw of the 30th past relate, that General Allard, who after the Battle of the Pruth quitted the Mulcovite Service, and came into his Polish Majesty's, was going back again to Muscovy. M. Buzenyal, the French Envoy there, had on the 23d his Audience of Leave of his Polish Majesty, and designed to set out in a few Days for Switzerland his Native Country, and thence to go to Paris.

The young Prince was named William Au-
