A PROCLAMATION, For apprehending and fecuring the Ferfons of Doctor Gaylard, Apprentice to Nathaniel Mift of Great Carter-Lane, in the City of London, Printer, and of Nachaniel Wilkinfon.

## GEORGER.

WHereas Docfor Gaylard, an Apprentice of Nathaniel Mifs of Great Csrter-Lane, in the City of London, Printer, axd Nathanill Wilkinfon, an Affftant to the faid Nathaniel Mift in compofing for the Prefs, ha. ving been fummoned to attend a Committee of the Houfe of Commens, appointed to enguire into atbe Auchers, Contrivers, Priaters, and Publifhers of the feditious and traiterous Libel, enttituled, I he Weekly Journal, or Sa. turday's Poft, with the fretheft Advices Foreign and Domeftick, Saturday, May 27, 1721, and all otber Seditious and traiterous Libels, which tend to raife Difcontents and Difaffections in the Minds of His Majeft's Subjetfs, did not obey the faid Swmmons: Wherexpon it was ordered by the faid Houfe of Commons, that the fatd Docior Gaylard and Nathaniel Wilkinfon foould be taken into the Cuflody of the Serjeaut at Arms attending the faid Houfe; but they bave abfconded, and cannot be apprebended. And whercas an bumble Addrefs bath been prefented to ms by the Knughis, Citizens, and Burgefes, wad the Commiffoners for Sbires and Burgbr, in Parliazuent affembled, that we would be gracioufy pleafed immediately to iffue our Royal Proclamation for apprebending she faid Boffor Gaylard and Nathaniol Wilkinfon, with a Promife of Revoard for the Same: We bave \$howght fir, by the Advice of our Privy Coxncil, to iffue this our Royal Proclamation, hereby requiring and commanding all our loving Subjectis whatfoever to difoover and apprebend, or carfe the fsid Doctor Gaylard and Nashaniel Wilkixfon to be difcovered and, apprebended, and so carry them before fome of our Ixffices of the Peace, or cbief Magiflrates of the Countr, Town, or Place, where shey, or either of them, fall be apprekended; who are refpectively regnired to fecure tbe faid Doczor Gaylard and Nathawiel Wilkinfon, fo apprebended, and thervof to give Speedy Notice to one of our princtpal Secretaries of Siate, to the end they may be fortb-coming, to be dealt soitbal and proceeded againf according to Law. And for the Prevention of the Efcape of the faid Doctor Gaylard and Nathaniel Wilkinfon into Parts beyond the Seas, we.do reguive and command all our officers of the Cuffoms, and other our Officers and Swbjeffs of and in our refpective Ports and Maritime Towns and Places with. in our Kingdom of Great Britain, that they, and every of them, in sheir refpetive Places and Stations, be careful and diligent in the Examination of all Perfons that faall pafs, or endeavour to pafs, beyothd the Scas; and if they 乃ball difoover the faid Doctor Gaylard and Nathanicl Wilkinfon, then to caufe them to be apprehended and feckred, and to give Notice thereof, as aforefaid, And we do bereby fritetly charge and command all our lovimg Subelfs, as they will anfwer the contrary at thcir Perils, bat they do not any woays conceal, but do difcover them 'be faid Doctor Gaylard and Nathaniel WilkinJon, to the ind they may be fecured. And for the Excouragesment of thl Perfons to be dilitent and carefal in endeavouring to ifcover and apprebend them the faid Doffor Gaylard nd Nashaniel Wilkinfos, we do hereby furthar declare, , hat whofocver fhall difcover and approbend them thr
faid Doctor Gaylard and Nathaxiel Wilkinfon, and fhell bring them before fopye fuflice of the Peace or cbief Mat gifrate, as afoicfard, flall bave and receive, as ia Reward for the Difovery, Apprefenting, and Bringling edich of them the faid Dorfor Gaylard and Nathanicl. Wilkinfon before fucb fuytice of she Peace or chief MagiArate, as aforefaid, the Sunn of Two Hundred Puunds, which our Commiffioners of our Tneafary are.hereby requor red and directed to pay accordingly.

## God fave the K I N G.

Lisben, Ffune 3, N. S. The Winchelfea, a Brif tifh Man of War, failed from bence the firt of this Month for Genoa, and carried 27000 L Sterling, as a Supply from the King of Portugal for his two Cardinals who lately went for Rome. Yefterday failed from hence the St Albans, a Britifh Man of War, for England This Court has received the News of Cardinal Conti's being elected Pope. He was formerly Nuncio in Portugal, and as he took Care to make himfelf very acceptable then, this Court is higbly pleafed at his Promotion. There have not been, in the Memory of Man, fuch continual Rains here as we have had during the whole Month of May, which ufually is the firft of the dry Seafon.

Stockholm, May 24, O.S. On the 18th 1nAtant Major Finboe arrived here Exprefis from Sir John Norris, with an Account that the Britifh and Swedifh Fleets were come to Elfenab. The fame Day Mr. Finch, His Buitannick Majefty's Minitter, went to Sir John Norris at Elfenab, and on the 20th returned with him hither. Sir John Norris an his Arrival waited upon the King, and his Majefty was pleafed so give him Audience immediately, though he had at that time a Return of his Ague, and was in Bed Yery much indifpofed. The next Day a Council of War was held, in which Sir Jobn Norris and the Swedifh Admirals, Count Sparre and Baron Watchmeifter, affitted. That Evening arrived an Exprefs at Court from Gafle, which brought Advice that a Body of Mufcovites had been on Shore, within three or four Swedifh Miles of that Place, but that they were gone off again, after having committed their ulaal Ravages. It is not yet known what Force they are of, of what Route they have taken. Sir Joho Norris and Admiral Sparre went down Yefterday Morning to the Fleete, and were followed this Morning early by their Excellencies Mr. Finch and Count Horn. As foon as the two latter come away, it is believed the Fleets will immediately putto Sea.
