THE Duke de Maine being reconciled with the Court, is restored to his former Employments of Great Master of the Artillery, and Colonel of the Swifs, but that of Superintendent of the King's Education which he had likewise heretofore, remains to the Duke of Bourbon. It is generally believed he will be re-established very soon in all his Honours and Prerogatives of Prince of the Blood. The Apartments which this Prince had formerly at the Arsenal are fitting up for him with all Diligence. On the 22d Instant a Council of Regency was held, wherein M. D'Armenonville Secretary of State, made his Report of the Memorial the Duke de la Force presented lately to the King; but it was resolved unanimously that this Memorial should be rejected, and the Petitioner obliged to take his Tryal before the Parliament, which will now go on with their Process against him. The same Day there was a Ball at the Opera, preceded by a Concert of Musick for the Diversion of the Turkish Ambassadour; and the Day following, being the Eve of the Festival of St. John the Baptist, there were Fire-works as usual at the Place of the Greve, which that Ambassadour saw likewise from the Town-House, where he was magnificently entertained by the Magistrates of this City. Madam de Rohan, Abbess of Jouarre, and Sister to the Cardinal of that Name, died some Days ago, the King has given that Abbey to Madam de Rohan, Niece to the Deceased. Madam de St. Contest, Mother to M. de St. Contest, one of the King's Plenipotentiaries at Cambray, died also last Week. There is a Report that the King has asked for a Cardinal's Cap for M. de Villeroy Archbishop of Lyons. Some Advices from Rome say, that the Pope had resolved to establish a Congregation for examining whether the late Pope's Constitution ought to have been received, and whether those of the Clergy of France, who refused it, had a Right so to do. M. Holzendorff, Secretary to Colonel Stanhope, arrived here last Night from Madrid, and proceeded a few Hours after on his Journey to England.

Whitehall, June 20. On Friday Night, the 16th Instant, arrived from Madrid Mr. Holzendorff, Secretary to Colonel Stanhope His Majesty's Ambassadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at the Court of Spain, with the Treaty of Peace and Commerce signed between His Majesty and the Catholick King: And

Yesterday an Express arrived from Madrid, who has brought to the Marquess de Pozzobuono, Minister Plenipotentiary of the King of Spain, Orders to deliver His Catholick Majesty's Cedula's, authorizing the South-Sea Company to carry on their Trade with New-Spain as before the War.

This Advance of 35,300 l. is in Lieu of Interest for the first Year.

The Blanks are to be paid off first, and afterwards the Prizes in Course.

The Courses of Payment to be settled by a Second Drawing of 1000 Tickets in a Course, as usual.

The Duty on Malt, 1721. to be appropriated for Payment thereof: And if any Deficiency appears at Michaelmas, 1722. such Deficiency to be Transferred to the First Supplies to be granted the next Sessions of Parliament.

The Money arising from that Duty to be paid by the Exchequer Weekly to the Bank; and by them applied to the paying the Blanks and Prizes in Course, as fast as it arises.

Such of the Blanks and Prizes, as shall not be paid off on or before 24 June, 1722. to carry Interest from that Time, at 4 l. per Centum per Annum, till paid off.

By this Method the Whole may be paid off in little more than a Years time.

And as only 2 l. can be lost on a Blank, the Risque to the Adventurers is less than in the late Lotteries.
