AMENDMENT OF PEDESTRIAN ZONE RESTRICTIONS - HESTER ROAD SW11

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Wandsworth proposes to make the following Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Traffic Management Act 2004—

- The Wandsworth (Prescribed Routes) (No. -) Traffic Order 20
2. The general effect of the amendment to the Prescribed Routes Order would be to clarify the intention of the Order with regard to the exemptions to the no entry prohibition in Hester Road for vehicles displaying a valid disabled person's badge and vehicles loading and unloading. Specifically, the amendment would clarify that goods carrying vehicles and vehicles displaying a valid disabled badge are only exempt from the no entry restriction if they are entering Hester Road to use the signed disabled/loading bays located there.
3. Copies of documents giving more detailed particulars of the proposed Order, including a plan showing the location of the restrictions and parking place, are available for inspection during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays in The Concourse, The Town Hall, Wandsworth High Street, London, SW18 2PU. The documents will remain available until the end of six weeks from the date on which the Order are made or, as the case may be, the Council decides not to make the Order.
