## - Vienna, June 14.

Y E have an Account from Servia, that the Balhaw of Niffa having lately caufed two Janifaries who had committed Diforders in the Town to be put under Confinement, the other Janifaries took them out of Prifon by Force; and afterwards entred into a Confpiracy to kill the Bashaw when he fhould be going to the Molque: He having Intelligence of it forbore going thither, and keeping within the Caftle, fecretly got toge-ther a good Number of Arnauts for his De-fence. The Janilaries attempting to force their Way into the Castle, met with fuch Opposi-tion, that 150 of them were killed on the Spot, and the rest repulsed. The Bashaw having afterwards reinforced his Body of Arnaute to fix or leven thousand, the Janifaries finding themselves outnumbered, quitted Nis-Ia, and fent an Officer to the Bashaw to make their Submiffion : The Bashaw refused to pardon them, unless they would deliver up the first-mentioned two Offenders, and 20 of the The Janifaries not yielding chief Mutineers. to this, have fent to their Comrades at Widin, Nicopolis, and other Places to join and affift them; and the Arnauts have fent like Invitations to those of their Order of the Militia throughout Scrvia, Bulgaria, Albania, and Macedonia.

Stockholm, May 31. The King has not fince this Day Seven-Night had any Symptoms of his Ague; and his Majefty is now very well again, though he ftill keeps his Chamber for Fear of another Relapfe, the Weather having been all this Month and ftill continues fo very raw, that they have not hitherto thought fit to let any of the Regiments which are here incamp. Prince George of Heffe, the King's Brother, fets out either To-Morrow or on Friday next for Carlfcroon, in order to pafs from thence by a Swedifh Frigate to Stetin or Wolgaft. The Southerly and Wefterly Winds keep the Fleets ftill at Elfenab.

Paris, June 28. The Memorial which the Duke de la Force presented lately to the King, and wherein he defired that the Cognizance of his Affair might be taken from the Parliament and brought before the Council, being rejected, the Parliament has summoned him to appear before their Commissioners in order to be con-
