Madrid, July 14.

THE Court continues at the Escorial, whither the Marquess de Lede went from hence on the 11th Instant, to receive the King's Orders for making the Reform resolved on among the Troops. His Majesty has been pleased to confer the Honour of Grandee of Spain of the first Rank, on the Marquess de Ariza of the Family of Palafox. On the 12th died suddenly the Count de Castellar, whose Estate is fallen to the Count de Estevan who married his only Daughter. The King has promoted M. de Marilly to the Rank of Lieutenant General. An Express from Cadiz has brought Advice, that the Gallies sailed from thence the 21st past for the West-Indies, under the Command of Lieutenant-General Don Balthasar de Guevara. This Flota consisted of 15 Sail, viz. four Men of War, 9 Merchant-Ships, and two Advice-Ships.

Copenhagen, July 19, N. S. On the 15th Instant the King declared Count Reventklau Great Chamberlain. The Queen of Denmark made her publick Entry the next Day into this City from Fredericksberg, all the Burghers being under Arms. The Procession was begun by all the Counsellours of Justice and those of State on Horseback; these were followed by 36 Coaches of the Nobility, each drawn by six Horses. The Queen's Coach was drawn by eight Horses, and in it sat the young Princess with her Majesty. The King, who had come to Town Incognito, received the Queen at the Palace. There was a very Magnificent Entertainment at Court, above 60 Persons dined with the King, and the rest at the Marshal's Table. The King supped that Evening with the Queen at her House near the Palace, and went back to Fredericksberg the same Night. The Court went this Morning to Fredericksburg, where they intend to stay some Days; and afterwards 'tis said the King will go to Holftein.

Berlin, July 19. On the 14th Instant the King of Prussia returned hither from his Progress into Prussia. On the 16th the Lord Whitworth, the British Minister, had Audience of his Majesty; and on the 17th set out for the Hague. M. Westphale, the late Danish Envoy at Petersbourg, having received Orders from his Court to go to Dresden, to no-

tify the Queen's Coronation, set out from hence some Days ago and is expected here very soon in his Way back to Copenh gen.

Paris, July 26. M. d'Ormeson, one of the Commissioners of the Finances is made Counsellour of State, in the Room of M. de Trudaine lately deceased. The Duke d'Aumont was taken ill on the 23d Instant of a Fit of Apoplexy, and continues in very great Danger. The Jesuits have been endeavouring underhand to obtain Leave to establish an University at Dijon; but that of Paris having got Notice of their Design, opposes it very strenuously. A Courier arrived here Yesterday in the Afternoon from Rome, with the News of the Pope's having named the Archbishop of Cambray and Don Alex. Albani to the Dignity of Cardinals. The Court has received a Letter from the Marquess de Pons, who commands at Toulon, with Advice, that the hot Weather had much diminished the Plague in that City. They write from Languedoc, that the Lines which had been drawn lately round la Canourgue were extended, in order to take in two small Villages in the Neighbourhood of that Place, which were suspected of the Infection.

Custom-House, London, July 19.

On the 13th Instant Daniel King, who keeps a China Shop in Fenchurch-Street, London, was convicted before the Lord Chief Justice Pratt, at Guildhall, for Publishing a Counterfeit Affidavit in the Name of Samuel Todd, of Colchester, Mercer; at which Trial it appeared that a Letter, in the Name of Thomas Rand, of Missing, in the County of Essex, Esq; was also Counterfeit, and that both the said Papers, together with a Memorial of Daniel King, had been produced by him to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order to clear 12 large Canisters of Tea stopt by the Officers of the Customs.
