HERE have been lately fome Disturbances in Egypt, which were suppressed by the Severity of the Bashaw; but that Severity rendred him so odious to the People, that they have deposed and put him into Prison, and have lately sent Deputies hither to justify their Proceeding, and desire a new Bashaw: The Grand Signior's first Resolution was to send an Army thither to reduce them to Obedience, but the Vizier has perswaded him to make Use of gentler Methods, and so a new Bashaw is appointed to go thither, with Instructions to paci-ly Matters, and govern the People with Mildness.

Genoa, July 15. On the 12th Instant arrived here His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Loo, Captain Protheroe Commander from Leghorne. Yesterday Commodore Scot, in the Dragon, with the Loo, failed towards the Coast of Catalonia.

Paris, July 30. On the 27th Instant the Duke Regent presented the Archbishop of Cambray to the King, to whom his Majesty deliver'd the Cardinal's Cap, which the Chevalier Lafitau, Brother to the Bishop of Sisteron brought from Rome. The King had given that Prelate some Days before the Abbey of Cercamp, which is worth 25000 Livres a Year. He did not affift at the last Council of Regency, wherein M. de la Vrilliere supply'd his Place, and will like. wife fign all the Disparches and Orders of the former's Province, till a new Secretary of State for foreign Affairs be chosen in his Room. Some say that Employment will be given to M. de Morville, one of the King's Plenipotentiaries at Cambray; and others name for Candidates M. de Bois Brother to the new Cardinal, and the Abbot de Thefu Chief Secretary to the Duke Regent. King has assigned to the Cardinal de Polignac, a Sum of 500000 Livres upon the Revenues of his Majesty's Domains. M. de Louville has sold his Government of Navarrins in Bearn, which is worth 8000 Livres per Annum, to M. d'Averne, for 80000 Livres; and the Revenue of that Government is augmented to 4000 Livres more in favour of this Gentleman, who has also obtained Leave to fell his Commission in the Guards, and will shortly be honour'd with the Order of Knight-hood of St Louis. The Chevalier de Lorrain, who in Consideration of his Marriage is obliged to quit his Benefices, will be made Knight of the Order of St. Lazare, to enable him to keep the Pensions which have been affigned to him upon several Benefices. The Duke de Bouillon died on the 26th The Duke d' Aumont, who had lately a Fit of Apoplexy, is on the mending Hand, having recovered his Speech which he had loft by that Accident. M. de Vaurey Intendant of the Marine at Toulon, was taken ill on the 27th Instant of an Apoplexy in the Church of the Little Augustins. M. de Lorangere, first Commissioner to M. de Turmeines the King's Treasurer, has been taken into Custody, being accufed of having shared some unlawful Profits with several Notaries of this City in the Delivery of the Contracts for Annuities, created some time ago upon the Aids and Gabelles. According to our Advices from Provence, the Plague continues to abate at Toulon, but destroys still a great Number of People in the neighbouring Towns and Villages. At la Canourgue the Number of the Dead and Sick increases, but the Sickness has not spread beyond the Lines which are drawn round that Canton.
