## Stockholm, August 9.

N the 3d Inftant Sir John Norris and Rear-Admiral Hopfon came hither from the Fleets at Capel-Share, and are both still in Town. The 3d being the Birth-Day of the Landgrave of Heffe-Caffel, the King and Queen received the Compliments of the Chief Perfons of Quality on that Occasion at Carlberg, in the Evening their Majesties came hither, and at Night there was a Ball. On the 4th the King found him-felf indifposed, and continuing fo the two following Days, his Majesty refol-ved to go and drink the Mineral Waters at Wyksberg, about fix Leagues from hence; whither he accordingly went on the 7th. The Queen came the fame

Day from Carlberg to the Palace here. Cadiz, Aug. 12. The Flota is expected Home from the West-Indies before the Thirteen Pieces End of this Month. of Cannon and two Mortars were late-ly fent from hence to Ceuta. The three Spanish Men of War of 50 to 60 Guns each, which carried the Spanish Cardinals to Italy, are now at Alicant: It is faid they are to join the Dutch Vice-Admiral, who is now in this Bay with four Ships of his Squadron of 50 Guns each, and cruize against the Algerines.
