'HE 8th Inflant, Sir John Norris with the British Fleet under his Command arrived off Dragoe, and the Wind not being fair he came to an Anchor at that Place the fame Night. Yefterday in the Morning he failed from thence, but the Wind changing he was obliged to anchor in this Road, and will take the Opportunity of the first fair Wind to proceed on his Voyage to Great Britain. Departure for Spain is put off till the 20th Infant. Befides his two Sons, the Abbot of St. Simon his Coufin and the Marquels de Lorge, are to accompany him; and 'ris reckoned his Retinue will confift of 120 Perfons. The King makes a Prifent to Madamoisfelle de Montpenfier of Jewels to the Value of 800000 Livres, and the Duke Regent a Prefent to the Value of 300000 Livres. The Marquels de Torcy is to have 200000 Livres for the Genetal Superintendancy of the Pofts of this Kingdom, which he has refigned to the Cardinal du Bois, belides a Penlion of 20000 Livres yearly for Life, and after his Death 9000 Livrea for his Lady during her Life, and 6000 Cartouche the notorious Robber, for his Son. who was taken fome Days ago, has already difcovered feveral of his Accomplices, who have alfo been taken up: The Gang of which he was Chief is found to be very numerous; and many of them being in the Provinces, Or-ders are fent thither to feize them. The fol-The following Extract of the Advices relating to the Plague received by the Court to the 13th of Offober, has been communicated to the foreign Miniflers.

'M. Le Bret writes the 28th of Provence. Sept. That Toulon keeps in a good State of Health, and that there are only Fevers there. Beffe is in a bad Condition; 15 Perfons and one Conful are dead there. Requebrouffane has the Infection ; but it is believed it will not be violent, the Force of the Diftemper appearing to abate every where. St. Remy is growing well, Cucurron does not yet. At Arles a Man is dead, with Marks of the Plague up At Arles a on him; This is difinal after a general Qua rantate, but it is hoped it will have no further Consequences.

The Comtat of Avignon. M. de Launay Commanding Officer in the County of Sault, in his Letter of the 2d of October writes, that a Peafant of the Comtat had been that for attempting in the Night to break through the Line on the Side of Suze ; and that the Centinels had fired at two Men on Horfeback who had advanced to make the like Attempt towards Moland. M de Chevalerie, the King's Lieutenant at St Elprit, writes, That befides Av gnon Bedarides, and Orange the Plague is at Chasteauneuf, Sorgues and Monteau, which are in the Neighbnuthood of Orange. M. de Nogaret advises Oft. 3. That the Diftemper Increases at Avignon, and that in all Likeli hord that Town will Juffer much, because the Μg ates had been forced to allow the People to get in their Vintage, to prevent a

general Revolt. M. de Belrieu writes the 1ff of Oct. That he had received a Letter dated the 26th of September, advising that 3ª Pers fons had died in Avignon within three Days, in different Parts of the Town. The Infest ba had got into the Vice Legate's Palace, which had abliged him to retire into a Convent of -Recollets. Bedarides rem ined in the lams Recollets. The Geva an M. de Fr iffe who com-mands at Mende, weites th 26th of Sept. That the Contagion is not fo violent there as at Marvejols : That but 82 Perfons had died there from the 4th of S. pt. to the 26th, and ten was the greateft Number that had died any one Day: There were then 43 fick in the Infirmary, and 41 suspected in a Convent cholen for that purpose. He took Care that all fufpected Persons were removed thither from their Houses, and had on that Account cleared one intire Quarter of the Place. M. de Rambion Brigadier of Foot writes the 27th of Sept, That M. de Rothe bad invefted St Geniez in the Vivarais, where feven or eight Perfort had died fince the 15th of Sept. They fee-med to have died of ordinary Diffempers 3 but it was feared they might have caught the Infection from a Muleteer who had given it to the Village of Rouffe. There are no fick in the Abbey of Chambon. Commiffa y Richard in his Letter of the 1ft of October lays, that from the 25th to the 27th of September 28 Persons died at Marvejols, and that of 150 who were fick there, two thirds were in Moulines and St. Ana way of Recovery. drioux are in a very bad State ; Vergogneux has had 60 dead in all, none fince the 23d of September. Couzes has loft 20. At the Vil-lage of Chabalius in the Parish of Chaffelade towards the Vivarez, fix died in one Houfe, being all the Perfons in it. At Rouffe, a young Woman is dead, and her Sifter is Sick. At Genouillac the 29th, three were fick, and one had died. At St. Genaix from the 26th to the 30th. fix died, and eight were fick.

All the Troops are in good Health. Auvergre, Velay, and Rouergue, continue in perfect Health.

This Day Baron Sparre, Richmond, Oft. 13. Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the King of Sweden, had Private Audiences of their Royal Highneffes the Prince and Princels of Wales, to notify the Peace lately concluded between his Mafter and the Czar of Muscovy; to which he was introduced by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt. Master of the Ceremonica.
