Comtat, where things go very ill.

M. de Vedrille who commands at Oursan, in his Letter of the 27th of November incloses two from the Confuls of Orange of the 19th and 22d of November, by which it appears that the Distemper does not make any Progress there, no more than one Person suspected of the Plague having fallen ill in the City since the 19th; but seven or eight Servants belonging to the in-

Senchon Subdelegate in his of the 20th of November sends a List, which shews the Number of the Dead at Avignon to the 24th of November to be 3320, and 1200 were then fick. The Worms do so abound in the Beds of the fick in the Infirmaries there, that they devour them, and 'tis impossible to keep them clear from them for want of Attendants in those Infirmaries; so that those who are taken sick chuserather to lye upon the Ground in the open Air, than to be carried into the Hospitals.
