Amending Royal Warrant

Elizabeth The Second, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of Our other Realms and Territories QUEEN, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith. To all to whom these Presents shall come,

Greeting!

WHEREAS His late Majesty King George the Fifth did by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual dated the Twenty-third day of March,

one thousand nine hundred and thirty four, institute the Colonial Police Long Service Medal;

AND WHEREAS His late Majesty King George the Sixth did by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual dated the tenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty eight, institute the Colonial Police Medal;

AND WHEREAS We did by Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the twenty-eighth day of October, one thousand nine-hundred and fifty-five, institute the Colonial Prison Service Medal;

AND WHEREAS We did by further Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the twenty-first day of March, one thousand nine-hundred and fifty-six, institute the Colonial Fire Brigades Long Service Medal;

AND WHEREAS We did by further Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the first day of April one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven, institute the Colonial Special Constabulary Medal;

AND WHEREAS We and Our Royal Predecessors did by the aforesaid Warrants make, ordain and establish rules and ordinances for the governance of the aforesaid Medals reserving to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these rules and ordinances or any part thereof;

AND WHEREAS We deem it expedient that the aforesaid Warrants shall be amended so as to provide that the Medals and Warrants shall hereafter refer to Our Overseas Territories and no longer refer to Colonies or Dominions;
