The Duke de Roquelaure, in his Letter of the 10th of March, advises, that the Goods and Merchandizes deposited in the publick Warehouses, and the Houses every where, were difinfecting (or purifying by Fumigation) with Succefs, and without Inconvenience. Marvejols had had none fick or dead of a long time. Mende had ftill 12 fick, but all out of Danger: The Phylicians there looked upon the Diftemper as ceafing in-Salle-gardon had three fick. tirely. Alais had three dead Bournaux three. and three newly taken ill from the 2d to the 7th. No more than two fick remained in the Infirmaries, of whom one who is the Confession's Servant gave hopes of Recovery, and the other is a Woman who had lain ill from the 1ft of February. The Chevalier Damas in his of the 9th of March confirms the general Decrease of the Plague, and affures us there are no more than 25 fick in all Languedoc. M. Bernard who commands at Alais writes the 2d and 9th of March, that Preparations were making for the general Quarantain, and that the Inhabitants had been warned to lay in Provifions for the time it was to laft. M. Vieuffens a Physician writes the 7th of March, that only two fick remained in the Infirmaries at Alais, that those Infirmaries would foon be shut up, and that he had great Hopes from the Quarantain which was to begin the 23d. M. de Rothe writes the 9th and 13th of March, that the Gevaudan was in a better State of Health daily. Commission Richard writes the 12th of March, that there are but eight fick in the feveral Places infected, and almost all likely to be cured, viz. two at Genouillac, two at Affions, two at Alais, and two at Mende. The Difinfection at Marvejols was ended. Some things folen out of the Infirmaries there had been recovered. The Quarantain for Health was going to be begun there. Bournaux, Concoules, St. Genaix, and Laurac, were still to be difinfected; all the other fmall Places within the Line had been perfumed. M. de Rambion writes the 9th of March, that for feveral Days none had fallen fick at Laurac. Within three Days two Perfons had died in two Villages within the

Blockade of St. Genaix; but none were fick there, from whence it was judged the Diftemper was drawing to an end.

The Comtat. M. de Nogarerz in his of the 9th and 12th of March advises, that he had an Account from the first Conful of Avignon, that no more than fix or feven Perfons died there a-Day, and five or fix fell fick. He learnt by the Difcourfe they had had together at the Barrier, that the Diftemper was not like to end foon there, the People continuing ungovernable. Vedene and Sorgues are ftill in a bad Condition: The laft of those Places has already loft half its Inhabitants. Monteux has relapfed after 43 Days Re-The Pofts of the Island of Bartaipite. laffe and of the Rhofne are very well kept: He makes frequent Turns thither. M. d'Orfay in his of the 15th of March. fends a Letter from his Subdelegate at Orange, dated the 28th of February, advifing that a Youth of that Town of 15 Years of Age had been taken ill of the Contagion, but it was not known by what Means he got it. Piolene in the Comtat had been suspected, but without Ground. Avignon had loft in the Month of February 227 Perfons. M. de Chabrillan writes the 9th and 14th of March, that very few who fell ill at Avignon escaped, especially in the Infirmary of St. Roch. Mon-teux, Sorgues, and Chaffeauneuf du Pape, are infected a-new ; but not violently. St. Savourmin, Cavaillon, Bedarides, and Piolene, are certainly well, though they have been fuspected. All the Line of the Comtat is in a good State of Health.
