Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea TALBOT ROAD AND SEVILLE STREET – REMOVAL OF PAY AND DISPLAY PARKING SPACES AND PROVISION OF TWO

ELECTRIC VEHICLES CHARGING PLACES THE KENSINGTON AND CHELSEA (CHARGED-FOR PARKING PLACES) (NO.1) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2013 AND

THE KENSINGTON AND CHELSEA (ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING PLACES) (NO. 1) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2013

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea on 21st March 2013 made the above-mentioned Orders under sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended. The Orders will come into operation on 4th April 2013 and may continue in force for up to 18 months. 2. The general effect of the Orders will be on an experimental basis:

(a) in Seville Street, on the west side, adjacent to No. 109 Knightsbridge, to remove 5 metres of pay and display parking space

and provide an electric vehicles charging place for one vehicle; and (b) in Talbot Road, on the north-west side, outside No. 126 Talbot

Road, to remove 5 metres of pay and display parking space and provide an electric vehicles charging place for one vehicle;

3. The electric vehicles charging places would be available at any time for the leaving of electric vehicles whilst they are charging at the adjacent charging point and for a maximum period of:

(a) 2 hours between 8:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive (excluding public holidays) for the parking place referred to in paragraph 2(a) above; and

(b) 4 hours between 8:30 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between 8:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. on Saturdays (excluding public holidays) for the parking place referred to in paragraph 2(b) above.

4. The charges for leaving a vehicle in the electric vehicles charging place during the hours specified in paragraphs 3(a) and (b) above will be the same as that for pay and display parking places within the tariff area in which they are each located, that being the high tariff for the parking place referred to in paragraph 2(a) above and the low tariff for the parking place referred to in paragraph 2(b) above.

5. A copy of the Orders and other documents giving more detailed particulars of the Orders can be inspected at the Council Offices, 37 Pembroke Road, London W8 6LZ during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

6. The Council will be considering in due course whether the provisions of the Orders should be continued indefinitely by means of Orders made under section 45 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Any person may object to the making of either of these Orders for the purpose of such indefinite continuation within a period of six months beginning with the day on which the Orders come into operation, or, if either of the Orders are varied by another Order or modified

pursuant to section 10(2) of the 1984 Act, beginning with the day on which the variation or modification or the latest variation or modification came into operation. Any such objection must be in writing and must state the grounds on which it is made and be sent to the Council's agents in this matter, the Project Centre, Fourth Floor, Westgate House, Westgate, London W5 1YY or email 1YY or Westgate House, Westgate, London traffic.orders@projectcentre.co.uk, quoting reference PCL/TMO/Electric Vehicle Charging Places.

7. Under the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985, any letter you write in response to this Notice may be made available to the press and to the public, who would be entitled to take copies of it if they so wished

8. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
