THE EALING (FREE PARKING PLACES) (NO. 2) (AMENDMENT NO. *) ORDER 201*

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the London Borough of Ealing propose to make the above mentioned Orders under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general effect of the Parking Places Order would be to provide additional stop and shop parking places on the north-west side of Featherstone Road opposite Nos. 115 to 121, 89 to 93 and 53 to 79. The parking places which would operate between 8.30 am and 6 pm on Mondays to Saturdays and between 2 pm and 6 pm on Sundays would be limited to a maximum stay of 1 hour with no return permitted for an hour. An extra 10 bays would be provided by these proposals. 3. The general effect of the Prohibition of Stopping outside Schools Order would be to formally remove the redundant school keep clear restrictions in Featherstone Road.
- 4. The general effect of the Prescribed Routes Order would be to revoke and re-enact the provisions of the Ealing (Prescribed Routes) (No.43) Traffic Order 2001 that impose one way working in a southwest to north-east direction in Featherstone Road (between the common boundary of Nos. 127 and 129 Featherstone Road and its junction with Dudley Road) so as to allow pedal cycles to enter Featherstone Road through the cycle by pass constructed south-west of the south-western kerb-line of the east to west arm of Featherstone Road and to then continue in a south-westerly direction in Featherstone Road in the advisory contra flow cycle lane marked on the road.
- 5. The Orders, other documents giving more detailed particulars of the Orders, are available for inspection at Customer Services Reception, Perceval House, 14-16 Uxbridge Road W5 2HL between 9:00am and 4:45pm on Monday to Friday, until 6 weeks have elapsed from the date on which either the Orders are made or the Council decides not to make the Orders.
