'HE Repairs and the fitting up of the Apartments of Verfailles, requiring more Time than was at first supposed, st is now faid the King will not go thither till about the Middle of next Month. We have Advice from Madrid, that the Count de Aguilar having fallen under the Displeasure of the King of Spain, had an Order fent to him to retire from Court within twenty four Hours, to his Government, which he not obeying readily, his Ca tholick Majefty ordered a Detachment of Guards to carry him to Corunna, where he is to be confined in Fort St. Antonio. The following Advices received by the Court relating to the Plague, have been communicated to the foreign Minifters.

The Duke deRoquelaure in his Letter of the 20th of April writes that all the Gevaudan continues in a good State of Health : He had Advices the 10th, that fince the 1st none had died or fallen fick in any of the Places formerly infected : Nor had any been newly taken ill in the Sevennes or the Vivarais, except one Woman in a Houle of the Parish of Jonas; but that Houle standing separate from others, and all neceffary Precautions being taken, it was hoped there would be no ill Confequences. At Alais the Quarantain was continued with good Effect; from the 2d to the 18th none had died or fallen fick, there remained in the Suburbs three Perfons who had recovered, and they were to be put forthwith under Quarantain : All Diligence was used in Perfuming and Airing the Houses, and it was believed the Plague had wholly ceased there. None had newly fallen fick in the Comtat; and it was judged that if the Difinfection or Perfuming was performed there with proper Care and Regularity, any Relaple might be prevented. The Bishop of Alais writes the 17th, that no Accident had interrupted the Quarantain, and that the Difinfection of the Infirmary would be finished in a Fortnight. M. de Bernage in his of the 17th, 19th and 20th of April gives the fame Account : Several Letters from Officers confirmed, that the Diffemper was ceafing every where. The Marquels de Brancas writes, that the Accident which happened at Marfeilles had not had ill Confequences. M. le Bret in his of the 15th of April relates, that the Father of the three Children who died at Matseilles, was also dead himself in the Lazaretto; but a Phyfician and Surgeon had made their Report, that it was of a Quinley, and that having viewed and opened his Body, they had The not discovered any Mark of Contagion.
