### London Borough of Havering

THE HAVERING (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (CIVIL ENFORCEMENT AREA) (NO. 1) (AMENDMENT NO. \*\*) ORDER 201\*

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Havering, hereinafter called the Council, propose to make the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The effect of the Waiting & Loading Restriction Order would be to impose waiting restrictions operative at any time on the lengths of streets specified in the Schedule to this Notice.
- 3. A copy of the proposed Order, of the Order being amended, together with the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order and plans showing the locations and effects of the Order can be inspected until the end of six weeks from the date on which the Order is made or as the case may be, the Council decides not to make the Order, during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive,
