lines') and provide a limited stay parking place in the same location that will operate from 10am to 6.30pm on Mondays to Saturdays with no return within 40 minutes and with a maximum stay period of 30 minutes between 10am and 6.30pm;

(c) reduce in length by 5 metres the ban on waiting by vehicles at any time in Brookbank Road, east of Shell Road; and

(d) make certain minor amendments to existing Traffic Management Order so as to accurately reflect signing and road markings on-street.

Exemptions from the restrictions include vehicles picking up and setting down passengers, vehicles being loaded or unloaded (subject to certain conditions and time limits), Council and utility company vehicles engaged on certain duties, vehicles stopping to avoid an accident, ambulance, fire brigade and police vehicles and anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

3. Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Orders can be inspected between the hours of 10am. and 4pm. on Mondays to Fridays until the last day of a period of six weeks beginning with the date on which the Orders are made, at the office of Lewisham Transport Policy & Development, Wearside Service Centre, Wearside Road, Ladywell, London, SE13 (tel. 020-8314 2570).

4. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.

- 3. The reason for proceeding by way of an Experimental Traffic Order is to assess the effects of providing additional secure cycle parking facilities.
- 4. These changes will be introduced for a trial period before consideration is given to whether the provisions of the Experimental Traffic Order should be made permanent.

Any comments in support of the Experimental Traffic Order are also invited during this period.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Experimental Traffic Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant enabling Act or that a requirement of any such enabling Act or of any relevant regulations made there under has not been complied with may, within six weeks from the date on which the Experimental Traffic Order was made, make application for this purpose to the High Court.
