Cadiz, June 23.

H E Spanish Squadron having entred the Streights has passed by Malaga, in order to cruife against the A'gerines. Two Ships of 50 Guns each, with Quickfilver for the West-Indies, are. in this Bay ready to fail, under the Command of Vice-Admiral Don Fernando Chacon, the Marquess of Cafafuerte goes over with them to his Viceroyship of Mexico. The Superintendant Don Joseph Patinno lets out from hence in a few Days for the Court of Madrid. Several Regiments have been lately reformed, and all remains quiet in these Parts.

Paris, July 15. Letters from Rome of the 13th past give an Account, That on the 9th Cardinal Althan went to the Quirinal Palace, accompanied by a great Number of Prelates: He was received in the Apartment used for the Reception of Crowned Heads, by the Pope's Majordomo attended by the Swifs, Guards : He was foon after introduced into the Confiftory, where in the Name of the Emperour he did Homage to the Pope for the Investiture of Naples and Sicily granted to his Imperial Majefty : Which done, he returned to his own Houle, the Pope refuting to treat him in the Palace with the Honours ulually shewn on fuch Occasions to a fecular Viceroy; because it appears by the Pontifical Registers, that in former Times those Honours uled to be paid only to fecular Viceroy», not to Cardinales for Inflance, the Cardinal of Arragon, in the Time of Pope Alexander the VIIth, went from Rome to his Viceroyship of Naples with-out receiving those Honours. As for the Difforences which have rifen between the Pope and the Emperour, touching the Nomination to Benefices, it has been agreed to divide them between them, the Pope being to pominate to one Half and his Imperial Majefty to the The Court of Spain had not made any other. Proteft at Rome, against the Pope's granting the forementioned Investiture to the Emperour. ther. Cardinal Zondadori had received Advice the fame Day, that his Brother the Great 'Mafter of Malta, who had been judged to be at the Point of 'Death, was in a way of Recovery. The Gevaudan. The Duke de Roquelaure in his Letter of the 3d of July writes, that the general Quarantain began the 1ft of July and will end the 10th of August : All Dispositions were made for performing it with all Exactness. M. de Bernage in his of the 3d fays, the good State of Health continued every where, and not one Perfor was fick of the Plague. M. de Rothe confirms the perfect Recovery of all the Places which had fuffered by the Contagion, and fays no Marks of the Distemper had appeared for a long time, which made it hoped the Quarantain would pass without any Accident.

Provence. M. le Bret writes the ift of July, that on the 29th of June three remained in the Hofpital at Marfeilles 50 Perform fick who were likely to do well, and 14 who had recovered. There was no Danger to be apprehended from the Village of Bouiffet and the Bastide of Bustrel. M. de Vibraye in bis of the 2d, fays he had an Account from Marfeilles by a Letter dated the 24th of June, that in the four preceeding Days none had fallen fick in the Town or in its Territory, and it was hoped the great Heats would have a good Effect.

The Comtat. The Marquels de Nogaret in his Letter of the 3d of July advifes, that 10 or 12 fell fick at Avignon, and about as many died where, a-Day. The Diftemper had foread into all Quarters of the Town; fome Convents, and leveral Houfes of Perfons of Note, which had long kept free, were infected. The Forces pofted along the Rhone and on the Hands, were very vigilant. M. de Vedrille in his of the 2d of July, fends inclosed a Letter from Avignon, confirming the bad Condition of that Town, the Poverty of the Inhabitants, and the Difficulty of keeping requisite Quarantains there for Want of Money. The Pope having ordered the Apostolical Chamber to lend them 100000 Roman Crowns, 25000 had been already remitted. The Abbot de la Fare has likewife fent a Letter from Carpentras dated the 26th of June, which confirms that 12 or 15 Perfons died, and as many fell fick, a-Day, at Avignon; where the Division among the MaMagistrates, and the Communication among the People, would probably keep up the Diftemper a long Time.
