Hambourg, Dec. 1. We have received from Molcow, an Extract of a Letter written by the Czar from Aftracan the 27th of October, to his Senate at Molcow, in which he gives them an Account, That after he had poffeffed himfelf of Derbent, he defigned to have made a further Progress, and therefore advanced to the River Melukenty; but then a Difappointment happened, for in a Storm upon the Cafpian, 13 Ships laden with Provisions from Aftracan, were loft : It was hoped that Lofs would have been repaired by the Arrival of a fecond Convoy under Captain Villeboir, but they had the fame Fate as the other. Hereupon the Store of Provisions he had with him being examined, it was found, that there was no more than would fubfift his Army for one Month, and that it was impossible to be time-ly supplied from Aftracan. Wherefore a Coun-cil of War being held, in which it was confidered that there was then no Enemy in that Part of the Country, and that the Scalon was far advanced, his Czarish Majesty resolved to finish the Campaign for this Year. That he had fecured Derbent and Tarku by putting into them Brong Garrifons : That in his Return coming to the River Zulach, he chole a proper Situation for erecting a Fort on the Side of it; and while the Work was in hand, he detached a Leader of the Coffacks with 1000 Coffacks and 4000 Calmucks, to enter the Territories of Prince Ufmeis of Daguestan, and of Sultan Mamuth of Ustemiche, who had attacked his Troops in their March to Derbent ; which Detachment having laid waste those Countries, joyned the Czar again at Agracan, After which he ordered his Cavalry to march to Aftracan, and having imbarked with his Infantry in the Gulph of Agracan, he arrived with the Czarina his Confort at Afracan the 15th of October. His Czarifh Majefty concludes his Letter by faying that he was latisfied with what he had done this Campaign, having made himfelf Mafter of a Town, and of a good Port on the Calpian Sea ; and that his Affairs requiring his speedy Return to Molcow, he expected the Senate would take Care that Change of Horfes and Carriages might be in Readincis on the Road from Aftracan thither.

Hague, Dec. 18. By Letters from Ratisbon we have an Account, that the Emperour's Commiffioners had proposed to the Dyet the granting eventually the Investitutes of the Dukedoms of Tuscany, Parma, and Placentia, purfuant
