Stockholm, January 16, O. S.

THIS Day the Meeting of the Dyet of the States of this Kingdom was published. On Monday next that Assembly will sit to do Business: The Choice of the Marshal will then likewise be made: The Court seems inclined to have M. Lagerberg put into that Post; and it is thought the Election will fall upon him. The King of Sweden came to Stockholm on Friday last.

Genoa, Jan. 26, N. S. Yesterday sailed from hence His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Leopard, Captain Medley Commander, bound for Great Britain, and will soon be followed by the Falmouth.

Lisbon, Feb. 3, N. S. Letters from Cadiz of the 17th past advise, that His Britannick Majesty's Ship Dursley Galley, was arrived in that Bay, and that the Galleons were daily expected there. On the 22d past, arrived in this River a Ship of 50 Guns called the Thetis, being one of those which were sent two Years ago to the South-Seas by the French West India Company; the Captain says, he touched at the Rio de Janeiro on the 22d of October last, and saw the Fleet which sailed from hence on the 29th of May, happily arrived there, and was assured that they might be expected at Lisbon before the End of March next. On the 12th past His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Lime entered this Harbour, the Colchester Man of War will sail in a few Days for Gibraltar, and the Drake Sloop will proceed for the Downs on the 6th Instant.

Hambourg, Feb. 9, N. S. We have Advice, that M. Jagofinsky the Czar's Minister, who a few Weeks ago came to the Court of Berlin, made several Journeys from thence, to Mentz, to Francfort, and lastly to the Court of the Prince of Hesse Hombourg. He staid three Days there, and had several Conferences with that Prince, who consented to let him take with him to Moscow the two Princes his Sons, one of 17, the other of 18 Years of Age. M. Jagofinsky took those two Princes with him to Leipfick, where he parted from them and went to Berlin to take an Audience of Leave of that Court. The two Princes were by M. Jagofinsky's Direction conducted from Leipfick by one M. Leewenwolde, to a Place called Biegen about eight German Miles from Berlin. M. Jagofinsky having left Berlin went to Biegen, whence he set out on the 29th of January, with the two Princes, towards Dantzick; from whence we learn that Quarters were

provided against his coming, and that he was very soon expected there, on his Way to Moscow.

Paris, Feb. 13. There will soon be made a Promotion of Dukes, in the Number of which will be M. de Biron and M. de Levi. His most Christian Majesty is at present in perfect Health; his Journey to this City, instead of being on the 15th, is only put off to the next Day.
