Nformation having been received from feve-ral Parts of the Kingdom, That in the Ex-ecution of an A&, paffed the laft Seffion of this pretent Parliament, Entituled, An A& to ob-lige all Perfons being Papifts in that Part of Great Eri-tain called Scotland, and all Perfons in Great Britain refuging or neglecting to take the Oaths appointed for the Sceurity of His Majefty's Perfon and Government, by feveral A&ts have mentioned, to regifter their Names and real Effates frome Doubt bath articin and real Estates, fome Doubt hath arifen, whe-ther the folemn Affirmation and Declaration of the People call'd Quakers, ought to be accepted and taken, as a full Compliance with the Direc-tions and Intent of that A&, there being no exrions and intent of that Act, there being no ex-prefs Provision therein for that Purpofe, by Rea-fon of which feveral Perfons of that Perfuasion, may through Ignorance of the Law, be unreafo-nably opprefs'd. To prevent therefore any ill Confequences of that kind, it is thought proper to infert in this Gazette the following Claufes of feveral Acts of Parliament. By an Act paffed in the first Year of the Reign of their late Majefries King William and Queen Mary, Entituled, An Act for exempting their Maj-flies Proteftant Subjects differing from the Church of Ergland, De-claration of Fidelity in the Form therein expref. fed is appointed to be made and fubscribed, by certain Persons Dissenters from the Church of England who icrupled the taking of any Oarh. By an A& paffed in the 7th and 8th Years of

By an Act passed in the 7th and 8th Years of the Reign of His late Majefly King William the I hird, Entituled, An Act that the folemn Affirma-tion and Declaration of the People call & Quskers shall be accepted instead of an Oath in the usual Form, It is enacted, That every Quaker within the Kingdom of England, Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick, who shall be required upon any lawful Occasion to take an Oath, where by Law an Oath is required, fhall inftead of the ulual Form be is required, thall initead of the ulual Form be permitted to make his or her folemn Affirmation or Declaration in thefe Words, viz I A. B. do Declare in the Prefince of almighty Gid, the Winefs of the Truth of what I fay. Which thall be ad-judged and taken to be of the fame Force and Effect to all Intents and Purpofes in all Courts of Juffice and other Places, as if fuch Quakers had taken an Oath in the ufual Form.

This A& being at first to continue in Force but for the Term of Seven Years, it was after-wards by another A& paffed in the 13th Year of his faid late Majeffy's Reign, Entituled, An A& for continuing an A&, cntituled, An A&, That the folemn Affirmation and Declaration of the People call' Quakers shall be accepted instead of an Oath in the usual Form; it was Enacted, That the faid recited A&, with all the Claufes and Powers therein con-tained, should continue and he in Force for and tained, fhould continue and be in Force for and during the further Term of Eleven Years (after the Determination of the faid Act)

By an Act passed in the faid Act) By an Act passed in the first Year of His pre-fent Majesty's Reign, Entituled, An Act for making perpetual an Act of the 7th and 8 b Years of the Reign of His late Maj fly King William the Third, Entituled, An Act, That the follown Affirmation and Declaration of the Pcople called Quakers shall be accepted instead of an Oath in the ufual Form; and for explaining and enforcing the faid Att in Relation to the Payment of Tythes and Church-Rates; and for appointing the Form of an Affirmation to be taken by the faid People called Quakers inflead of the Oath of Abjuration. After recuakers initial of the Oath of Abjuration. After re-titing the before-mention'd feveral Acts of the 7th, and 8th, and 13th of His faid late Majefly's Reign, it is Enacted, That the faid first recited Act, and all the Claufes and Powers therein contained, fhall continue and be in Force for ever, as to all Oaths by Law required, or hereafter to [Price Three-Half Pence.]

be required, other than and except as in the faid first recited Act is excepted.

In the faid last mentioned Act, there is also inforted at large the Form of an Affirmation to be taken by the faid People called Quakers inflead of the Oath of Abjuration, which Form many Per-fons of that Perfwalion fcrupling and refuling to comply with and take ; it was further Enacted by an Aft paffed in the \$th Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, (Entituled, An Act for granting the People called Quakers such Forms of Affirmation of Declaration as may remove the Difficulties which many of them lie under.) That in all Cases where by Law any Quaker is or shall be required or permitted to make and fubscribe the Declaration of Fidelity in the Form preferibed by the faid first mentioned Act, or to make the folemn Affirmation or Declaration in the Form preferibed by the faid Act of the 7th and 8th Years of the Reign of his faid late Majefty King William the Third, or to take the Effect of the Abjuration Oath in the Form preferibed by the faid Act of the firft Year of His piefent Majefty's Reign, every fuch Quaker shall, instead of fuch first mentioned Declarationsof Fidelity, make and fubscribe a Declaration of Fide-

lity in the following Words, w/z. I \mathcal{A} . B. do folemnly and fincerely promife and declare, That I will be true and faithful to King George, and do folemnly, fincerely, and truly profefs, teftify, and declare, that I do from my Heart abhor, deteft, and rencunce, as impious and heretical, that wicked Dectrine and Polition, That Princes excommunicated or Deprived by the Pope, or any Authority of the See of Rome, may be depofed or murthered by their Subjects, or any other whatfoever. And I do declare, That no Foreign Prince, Perfon, Prelate, State or Fotentate, hath or ought to have, any Power, Jurifdiction, Supe-riority, Preheminence or Authority, Ecclefi-aftical or Spiritual within this Realm.

And inftead of the folemn Affirmation or Declaration in the Form prefcribed by the faid Act of the 7th and 8th Years of the Reign of his faid late Majefty King William the Third, every fuch Quaker thall make the folemn Declaration or Affirmation following, viz.

I A. B do folemnly, fincerely, and truly declare and affirm.

And infread of the Form preferibed by the faid Aft of the firft Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, for the Effect of the Abjuration Oath, e-very fuch Quaker fhall take the Effect thereof in the following Words, viz. I A. B. do folemnly, fincerely, and truly ac-knowledge, profefs, teftify, and declare, That King George is lawful and rightful King of this Realm, and of all other His Dominions and Countries thereunto belonging. And I do fo-

Countries thereunto belonging. And I do fo-lemnly and fincerely declare, that I do believe the Perfon pretended to be the Prince of Wales, during the Life of the late King James, and fince his Decease, pretending to be, and taking upon himfelf the Stile and Title of King of England, by the Name of James the Third, or of Scotland, by the Name of James the Eighth, or the Stile and Title of King of Great Britain, hath not any Right or Title whatfoever to the Crown of this Realm, nor any other the Dominions thereunto belonging : And I do renounce and refuse any Allegiance or Obedience to him. And I do folemnly promife, that I will be true and faithful, and bear true Allegiance to King George, and to Him will be faithful against all traiterous Confpiracies and Attempts whatfo-ever, which shall be made against his Person, Crown, or Dignity.
