For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "- ELIZABETH II  $\cdot$  D  $\cdot$  G  $\cdot$  REG  $\cdot$  F  $\cdot$  D  $\cdot$  100 POUNDS", and for the reverse a rearing unicorn accompanied by a shield depicting a lion rampant with the inscription "UNICORN OF SCOTLAND 10Z  $\cdot$  FINE GOLD  $\cdot$  999.9  $\cdot$  2018". The coin shall have a grained edge.'

## **TWENTY-FIVE POUND COIN**

- 2. (1) A new coin of gold of the denomination of twenty-five pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 7.80 grammes, a standard diameter of 22 millimetres, a millesimal fineness of not less than 999.9. and being circular in shape.
- (2) In the making of the said gold coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or diameter specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.025 grammes; and
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin.
- (3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of the coin.
- (4) The least current weight of the said gold coin shall be 7.75 grammes.
- (5) The design of the said gold coin shall be as follows:
- For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "- ELIZABETH II  $\cdot$  D  $\cdot$  G  $\cdot$  REG  $\cdot$  F  $\cdot$  D  $\cdot$  25 POUNDS", and for the reverse a rearing unicorn accompanied by a shield depicting a lion rampant with the inscription "UNICORN OF SCOTLAND 1/4OZ  $\cdot$  FINE GOLD  $\cdot$  999.9  $\cdot$  2018". The coin shall have a grained edge.'

## ONE HUNDRED POUND PLATINUM COIN

- 3. (1) A new coin of platinum of the denomination of one hundred pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 31.21 grammes, a standard diameter of 32.69 millimetres and being circular in shape.
- (2) In the making of the said platinum coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or diameter specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.15 grammes; and
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin.
- (3) The said platinum coin may contain impurities of five-tenths of one per centum.
- (4) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of the coin.
- (5) The composition of the standard trial plates to be used for determining the justness of the said platinum coin shall be pure platinum.
- (6) The design of the said platinum coin shall be as follows:
- 'For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "- ELIZABETH II  $\cdot$  D  $\cdot$  G  $\cdot$  REG  $\cdot$  F  $\cdot$  D  $\cdot$  100 POUNDS", and for the reverse either:
- (a) a griffin accompanied by a shield depicting the badge of the House of Windsor with the inscription "GRIFFIN OF EDWARD III  $\cdot$  10Z FINE PLATINUM  $\cdot$  999.5  $\cdot$  2018"; or
- (b) a rearing unicorn accompanied by a shield depicting a lion rampant with the inscription "UNICORN OF SCOTLAND 1OZ  $\cdot$  FINE PLATINUM  $\cdot$  999.5  $\cdot$  2019".

The coins shall have a grained edge.'

(7) The said platinum coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

# **TEN POUND COIN**

- 4. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of ten pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 311.527 grammes, a standard diameter of 89.15 millimetres, a standard composition of not less than 999.9 parts per thousand fine silver, and being circular in shape.
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or diameter specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.48 grammes; and
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin.
- (3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of the coin.
- (4) The design of the said silver coin shall be as follows:

- 'For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "· ELIZABETH II · D · G · REG · F · D · 10 POUNDS", and for the reverse either:
- (a) a griffin accompanied by a shield depicting the badge of the House of Windsor with the inscription "GRIFFIN OF EDWARD III 100Z  $\cdot$  FINE SILVER  $\cdot$  999.9  $\cdot$  2018"; or
- (b) a rearing unicorn accompanied by a shield depicting a lion rampant with the inscription "UNICORN OF SCOTLAND 100Z  $\cdot$  FINE SILVER  $\cdot$  999.9  $\cdot$  2019".

The coins shall have a grained edge.'

(5) The said silver coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

#### **FIVE POUND SILVER COIN**

- 5. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of five pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 62.42 grammes, a standard diameter of 38.61 millimetres, a standard composition of not less than 999.9 parts per thousand fine silver, and being circular in shape.
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or diameter specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.195 grammes; and
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per
- (3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of the coin.
- (4) The design of the said silver coin shall be as follows:
- For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "- ELIZABETH II · D · G · REG · F · D · 5 POUNDS", and for the reverse a rearing unicorn accompanied by a shield depicting a lion rampant with the inscription "UNICORN OF SCOTLAND 2OZ · FINE SILVER · 999.9 · 2018". The coin shall have a grained edge.'
- (5) The said silver coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

## **FIVE POUND CUPRO-NICKEL COIN**

- 6. (1) A new coin of cupro-nickel of the denomination of five pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 28.28 grammes, a standard diameter of 38.61 millimetres, a standard composition of seventy-five per centum copper and twenty-five per centum nickel, and being circular in shape.
- (2) In the making of the said cupro-nickel coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight, composition or dimensions specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.75 grammes;
- (b) a variation from the said standard composition of two per centum copper and two per centum nickel; and
- (c) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin.
- (3) The variation from the standard weight will be measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogram of the coin.
- (4) The said cupro-nickel coin may contain impurities of three-quarters of one per centum.
- (5) The design of the said cupro-nickel coin shall be as follows:
- 'For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "- <code>ELIZABETH II</code>  $\cdot$  D  $\cdot$  G  $\cdot$  REG  $\cdot$  FID  $\cdot$  DEF  $\cdot$  5 POUNDS", and for the reverse either:
- (a) a lion accompanied by a shield depicting Our Royal Arms with the inscription " $\cdot$  LION OF ENGLAND  $\cdot$ " and the date of the year; or
- (b) a rearing unicorn accompanied by a shield depicting a lion rampant with the inscription " $\cdot$  UNICORN OF SCOTLAND  $\cdot$  " and the date of the year.

The coins shall have a grained edge.'

- (6) The said cupro-nickel coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.
- 7. This Proclamation shall come into force on the fifteenth day of June Two thousand and seventeen.
- Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this fourteenth day of June in the year of Our Lord Two thousand and seventeen and in the sixty-sixth year of Our Reign.
