Madrid, November 1, N.S.

THE Court still continues at St Idefonso, and it is believed will not return hither till the 24th of December. The 25th of last Month being the Queen's Birth-day, on which she entered into the 32d Year of her Age, it was celebrated at Court with the usual Magnificence. Last Week came an Order from his Catholick Majesty, for Banishing from hence to different Places several young Noblemen, for Leading dissolute Lives, and for Abusing the Officers of Justice, viz. the Marquis de Castromonte a Grandee of Spain, to Corunna; his Brother Don Lucas de Bazza, to Bilbao; the Conde d'Elda, of a Grandee Family, to Cadiz; the Marquis de Mexorada, to Barcelona; and Don Manuel de Leyva, to the Castle of St. Antonio in Galicia; the Abbot Cantelmo, Brother to the Duke of Popoli, is likewise ordered to retire to Piedra buena. On the 28th past an Auto de Fé was held at Toledo, when several Persons were by the Tribunal of the Inquisition delivered over to the Secular Arm, and burnt.

Portsmouth, Nov. 5. On the 1st Instant arrived here from Gibraltar the Anne Galee of Bright-helmstone, James Cook Master, having on Board Hag Abdalcader Peres Admiral of the Emperour of Morocco's Fleet and his Ambassadour to His Majesty, with his Retinue and some Presents from his Master to His Majesty. Mr. Arnold, Collector of the Customs in this Port, went on Board the said Ship, and invited the Ambassadour to his House; accordingly he landed with his Attendance Yesterday, having the usual Honours shewn him, and being complimented by the Governour and Officers of the Garrison. Notice having been sent up of his Arrival, Coaches are expected for carrying him and his Retinue to London.

It is advised from Florence, that Cosmo de Medicis the Third of that Name, Great Duke of Tuscany, died there the 20th of last Month, O. S. in the 82d Year of his Age. He is succeeded by his Son the Great Prince John Gaston.

His Majesty having been pleased to nominate the Reverend Dr. Richard Smallbroke, one of His Majesty's Chaplains, to the See of St. David's, vacant by the Death of the Right Reverend Dr. Adam Otley; a Congé d'Elire is accordingly passing the Seals.

The Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, observing in the Comptrolling the Payments of Ships, and Paying upon the List of Arrears, that several Letters of Attorney and other Powers of old Dates are produced for receiving Seamen's Wages, and it being probable that many of the Parties who executed the same are dead, as well as some to whom the said Letters of Attorney, &c. were made: To prevent therefore for the future, as much as possible, any Abuses His Majesty or His Subjects may be exposed to thereby, or by false Powers, several of which have been detected; These are to give Notice, That no Wages for any Man's Service in His Majesty's Ships, will be paid where the Person does not appear himself (or the Witness to his Letter of Attorney) by any Power but such as shall be Witnessed by two or more Commissioned or Warrant Officers of His Majesty's Ships in which they serve, or by two or more of the Officers of His Majesty's Yards, or by the Mayor or two or more of the Magistrates of some Corporations or by the Minister and Church-Wardens of the Parish, (where the other cannot be had,) or here in London by a Publick Notary, or some of the Officers or Clerks of the Navy; and all Attornies are to give good and sufficient Proof that the Persons are living for whom they receive the Money by Virtue of such Powers, or produce new Letters of Attorney for such living Persons attested in the Manner aforesaid.
