THE King of Prussia arrived here the 11th Instant, about Six in the Evening, attended by M. Gerisdorff, Loven, Dockum, and others of his General Officers, and was received with all Marks of Esteem and Affection by the King, and with due Honours by the Court. Their Majesties have since been several Times a Stag-hunting, accompanied by the Duke of York and Prince Frederick, with a very numerous Attendance; and have every Day Dined and Supped together in publick, having with them at the same Table, the Duke of York, and Prince Frederick, with the Duke and Dutchess of Blankenbourg. The King of Prussia during his Stay here, shewed the greatest Deference and Affection for His Majesty, and a very particular Regard for Prince Frederick, and was extremely satisfied with his Reception and Entertainment. This Morning about Five a-Clock his Prussian Majesty set out from hence, intending to reach Berlin To-Night. On the 22d the Duke of York will set out on his Return to Osnabrug; and the Duke and Dutchess of Blankenbourg will leave this Place the same Day. His Majesty intends to set out the 24th with Prince Frederick for Hanover, and to get thither that Evening.
