A Placard has been pub-lifhed by Order of the States of the Province of Holland, laying a Duty of four Guilders a Head on all Oxen imported from Denmark during this Year and the next, which is increased to 8 Guilders in 1726, 12 in 1727, 76 in 1728, and 20 in 1729, which last Tak is to be continued from that Time forward. The Importation of any Salt Flefh is by this Placard prohibited, except Ba-con and Hams, which may be brought into this Country ftill, paying the usual Duties. On the gth Inflant, M. Bantry, Dec. 4, 1723. O N Friday the 29th of November ult. a Sloop of about 40 Tons, arrived in our Harbour of Bantry, commanded by John Applegath, and having three other Men and one Boy on Board : He called ber the William and Thomas of Cromerty in Scotland, pretended the was homeward bound from the Ifland Palma, with a little Wine and fome Pitch, and told a formal Story to that Purpole, but fuffering much in their Paffage thro' the Severity of Weather, did not think it worth while to carry her Home, and therefore exposed the Veffel and Cargo to Sale in this Place, and accordingly that fame Evening fold them to Henry Galwey, Mer-chant in this Town.

But by Information fince given to us, the Fact is, That about the Beginning of August last, the Thomas and Anne Sloop of London, Thomas Reay (a Quaker) Master, of about 40 Tons, failed in Ballast from the River Thames to Short the State Sailand to Shoaram, with the faid Mafter, three Sailors, and the faid Boy on Board; at Shoaram they In the Gaze took; in a Loading of Wheat upon Freight to the ist Link of Lisbon; where they deliver'd that Cargo, and the January 2.

three Sailors leaving the Master, he hired three more there, and took in a Loading of Salt and Tobacco on the King of Portugal's Account for the Ifland of Se. Michael's, where they arrived in the Beginning of October, and having delivered the Iobacco and most of the Salt, they took in Part of another Loading of Wheat on the fame Account for the Garrilon of Maflagan on the Coaft of Barbary, and moft of the faid Loading being on Board, and the faid Mafter Thomas Ray fick on Shore, John Applegath and the other two Sailors cut the Cables in the Evening about the 20th of October, and run away with the Veffel and Cargo and Boy to the Ifiand Palma, where John Applegath assuming to be Master and Part Owner, changed the Name of the Veffel, and called her the William and Thomas, and felling the Cargo, took in fome Wine and Pitch, but being frighten'd by an Account of another Ship making into the fame Bay, hoifted Sails and put to Sea with little or no Lozding or Provifis ons on Board, and went round the Western Illands to prevent a Purfuit, and after 30 Days and a great deal of bad Weather arrived in Bantry on the 29th of November laft.
