Madrid, Dec. 27, N. S. Their Catholick Majesties continue at St. Ildefonso, without having yet fixed any Time for their Return hither. The King having given Order for his Goldsmith to get eight Badges of the Golden Fleece to be made forthwith, a Promotion of Knights of that Order is shortly expected. His Majesty having referred to the Intendant Don Joseph Patino the Discussion of the Difference between Don Carlos Grillo, General of the Galleons, and the Viceroy of Peru Don J. Armandariz Marques de Castileuerte, he has made them Friends. Don Antonio de Bohargues is making Preparation to set out from hence the Middle of next Month, to take Possession of the Government of Cadiz lately conferred upon him: Our last Advices from that Place tell us, the Galleons would be ready to put to Sea the 28th Instant.

Hague, Jan. 11, N. S. A Placard has been published by Order of the States of the Province of Holland, laying a Duty of four Guilders a Head on all Oxen imported from Denmark during this Year and the next; which is increased to 8 Guilders in 1726, 12 in 1727, 16 in 1728, and 20 in 1729, which last Tax is to be continued from that Time forward. The Importation of any Salt Flesh is by this Placard prohibited, except Bacon and Hams, which may be brought into this Country still, paying the usual Duties. On the 9th Instant, M. Pestors set out from hence, to return to his Residence at Brussels. Prince William of Hesse being arrived from Cassel at Maestricht, has taken Possession of the Government of that Place, which the States conferred on him some Time ago.

Whitehall, January 7, 1723.

Whereas Thomas Miller, of Upton in the County of Berks, a well-sized Man, aged about 30, and William Hicks, Bell-Founder by Trade, a short Man, of the ſame Age, having been charged upon Oath, before Harry Bridges, Eſq; one of His Maſteſty's Juſtices of the Peace at Keynſham near Bath, with falſe coining and counterfeiting of the current Money of this Kingdom, were by His Miteſty put into the Cuſtody of a Tithingman with a ſtrong Guard, to be by him carried to the County-Goal, but found means to make their Eſcape: His Maſteſty is graciously pleaſed to promiſe, that whoever ſhall apprehend the ſaid two Offenders, or either of them, ſhall upon the Conviction of them, or either of them, receive the Reward of 50 l. for each, beſides what Rewards they may be legally intitled to.

His Grace the Duke of Graſton Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, having tranſmitted to His Maſteſty the following Extract of a Letter from Richard Davies and Richard White, Eſq; Juſtices of the Peace, dated at Bantry in the County of Corke, Dec. 4, 1723, His Maſteſty has been pleaſed to give Direction that the ſame ſhould be publiſhed, ſo the end the Owners of the Veſſel may take ſuch Meaſures as the Law appoints for recovering it, and for puniſhing the Criminals, who are kept in Cuſtody in Ireland in order to their being brought to Juſtice.

Bantry, Dec. 4, 1723.

ON Friday the 29th of November ult. a Sloop of about 40 Tons, arrived in our Harbour of Bantry, commanded by John Applegath, and having three other Men and one Boy on Board: He called her the William and Thomas of Cromerty in Scotland, pretended ſhe was homeward-bound from the Iſland Palma, with a little Wine and ſome Pitch, and told a formal Story to that Purpoſe, but ſuffering much in their Paſſage thro' the Severity of Weather, did not think it worth while to carry her Home, and therefore expoſed the Veſſel and Cargo to Sale in this Place, and accordingly that ſame Evening fold them to Henry Galwey, Merchant in this Town.

But by Information ſince given to us, the Faſt is, That about the Beginning of Auguſt laſt, the Thomas and Anne Sloop of London, Thomas Reay (a Quaker) Maſter, of about 40 Tons, failed in Ballaſt from the River Thames to Shoaram, with the ſaid Maſter, three Sailors, and the ſaid Boy on Board; at Shoaram they took in a Loading of Wheat upon Freight to Liſbon; where they deliver'd that Cargo, and the

three Sailors leaving the Maſter, he hired three more there, and took in a Loading of Salt and Tobacco on the King of Portugal's Account for the Iſland of St. Michael's, where they arrived in the Beginning of October, and having delivered the Tobacco and moſt of the Salt, they took in Part of another Loading of Wheat on the ſame Account for the Garrifon of Maſſagan on the Coaſt of Barbary, and moſt of the ſaid Loading being on Board, and the ſaid Maſter Thomas Ray lick on Shore, John Applegath and the other two Sailors cut the Cables in the Evening about the 20th of October, and run away with the Veſſel and Cargo and Boy to the Iſland Palma, where John Applegath aſſuming to be Maſter and Part Owner, changed the Name of the Veſſel, and called her the William and Thomas, and ſelling the Cargo, took in ſome Wine and Pitch, but being frighten'd by an Account of another Ship making into the ſame Bay, hoisted Sails and put to Sea with little or no Loading or Proviſions on Board, and went round the Weſtern Iſlands to prevent a Purſuit, and after 30 Days and a great deal of bad Weather arrived in Bantry on the 29th of November laſt.
