AN humble Address of the Governour and Council of His Majesty's Province of Nova Scotia in North America, was this Day presented to His Majesty by Colonel Philipps Governour of that Province, being introduced by the Right Honourable the Lord Carteret.

Whitehall, April 3.

The King has been pleased to appoint his Grace Thomas Holles Duke of Newcastle, to be one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Henry Pelham, Esq; to be Secretary at War to all His Majesty's Forces raised or to be raised in the Kingdom of Great Britain and Dominion of Wales.

Charles Dubourgay, Esq; to be His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the King of Prussia.

Edward Finch, Esq; to be His Majesty's Plenipotentiary at Ratisbon.

Charles Harrison, Esq; to be His Majesty's Resident at the Court of Vienna.

Francis Colman, Esq; now His Majesty's Secretary at Vienna, to go with the Character of His Majesty's Resident to the Court of the Great Duke of Tuscany.

Edward Barker, Esq; to be Secretary to the Governours of the Bounty of Queen Anne, for the Augmentation of the Maintenance of the Poor Clergy.

His Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Right Reverend Dr. Henry Downes Lord Bishop of Elphin in the Kingdom of Ireland, to be translated to the See of Meath, vacant by the Death of Dr. John Evans.
