H E States of the Province of Holland having fome Days ago paffed a Refolution in their Affembly to fend the Penfionary M. Buys to Denmark, in order to the Differences terminate between that Crown and this State, and to renew the Treaty of Commerce ; it was taken into Confi-deration by the States General on the 13th Instant, and approved ; fo that M. Buys will fer out very fhortly for Copenhagen, being autho rifed to take on him the Character of Ambalfadour when he shall judge proper, which it is Supposed will be at Signing the Treaty : Which done, he will return hither, leaving the Care of the Affairs of this State at that Court to an Ordinary Minister, who is foon to follow him to Copenhagen, and who it is thought will be M. Fabricius, Penfionary of Purme-rende. M. de Noortwick, of the Body of the Nobles, President of the Gecommitteerde Raede, died this Morning.

Whitehall, May 6, 1724.

His Majefty being defirous, that in the Difpofal of Ecclefiaftical Promotions, a juft Regard fhould be had to the Clergy in all Parts of the Nation, who are Perfons of good Learning and lober Converfation, and of known Affection and Zeal for His Government; and that the Difpofition of the Benefices in the Gift of the Crown fhould be put into fuch a Method as may moft 'effectually conduce to that End; hath been gracioufly pleafed to declare, That henceforth when any Benefice -with Cure of Souls which is in His own Gift, fhall become Vacant, it fhall be beftowed upon fome Clergy-'man qualified as above, who, at the time when fuch Vacancy happens, fhall be an Incumbent, or officiating Curate duly licenced, within the County, or at leaft within the Diocefe to which fuch Benefice belongs; or elfe to fuch Perfon in the two Univerfities as is a Native of fuch County or Diocefe, and fhall be in Holy Orders at the Time when the Vacancy happens. And to the end the aforefaid Rule may be punctually obferved in the Difpofition of all Benefices belonging to the Crown, His Majefty hath further ordered, That Entries thereof be made in the Offices of his two Principal Secretaries of State : And the Lord High Chancellour of Great Britain, upon His Majefty's Recommendation, is determined to obferve the fame Rule in the Difpofal of fuch Benefices with Cure of Souls belonging to the Crown, the Patronage whereof appertains to his Lordfhip's Office,
