Tuein, June 7, N S. The King of Sardinia having done Mr Molesworth the British Envoy the Honour to fend the Marquess d'Angrogne Master of the Ceremonies, to notify the Conclusion of a Marriage between the Prince of Piedmont and the Princess of Rhinseltz, that Minister went Yesterday to the Veneria to compliment their Ma-jesties and the Prince upon this Occasion. The Marquefs de Breuil Envoy from this Court at Vienna, is to go Ambassadour to Paris; and the Marquess d'Aix is to succeed him at the Emperour's Court. They write from Paris, that the Marquess de Cambises is named to reide here in the Quality of Ambassadour; and it is expected the Marquess de Santa Cruz, who has adjusted the Dispute about the Cannon of Sardinia for which he was Hostage, will soon take a publick Character as Minister from the King of Spain. The Court fets out for Savoy the End of this Month: His Sardinian Majesty will go first to Thonon, where he intends to drink the Waters

of Amphion, and will afterwards take up his Re-fidence for a Time at Chambery.

Stockbolm, May 20. The Queen being perfect-ly recovered of a late Indisposition, and the King having sent Word that he designed to be back here last Night from Romansoe, her Majesty went Yesterday Morning to a Seat of the younger Marshal Duben's about three Leagues from hence, where the King arrived about Noon; and after dining there, their Majesties came to Town in the Evening. Paris, June 14, N. S. On the 3d Instant the new Knights of the Holy Ghost were received into that Order by the King at Verfailles, with the usual Ceremonies. The most Christian King designs to go the 30th of this Month to Chantily, the Seat of the Duke of Bourbon first Minister; and the feveral Councils are to repair thither. His Majesty will stay there about three Weeks, and the Count de Morville Secretary of State, is to come hither once a Week to give Audience to the foreign Ministers.

Hague, June 16, N.S. Collonel Du Bourgay, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the King of Prusia, landed at Rotterdam on the 9th Instant: On the 11th he came hither, and returning the same Day to Rotterdam, set out from thence on the 13th for Utrecht, whence he will proceed on his Journey to Berlin. The Da nish Minister here is preparing to go to Aix Ia Chapelle, to wait on the King his Master, who with the Queen continues there, Dublin-Castle, June 2. On the 20th past a Commission having passed the Great Seal of Ireland, appointing the Right Honourable Alan Lord Viscount Middleton Lord Chancellour of that Kingdom, Richard Lord Viscount Shannon Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Forces there, and William Conolly, Esq; Speaker of the House of Commons of Ireland, to be Lords Justices during the Absence of His Excellency John Lord Carteret Lord Lieutenant of the faid Kingdom, the said Lords Justices were accordingly fworn in Council; and they have fince appointed Thomas Tickell, Esq; to be their Secretary.

For Relief of all Massers and Mistresses who have omitted to pay His Majesty's Duties of SIX PENCE IN THE POUND for every Sum of Fifty Pounds or under, and of TWELVE PENCE IN THE POUND for every Sum amounting to more than Fifty Pounds G. ven, Paid, Contracted or Agreed for with Clerks and Apprentices, within the respective Times limited by the several Acts of Parliament in that Case made; Or who have omitted to insert and write in Onfo made; Or who have omitted to infert and write in Words at length in the Indentures, or other Writings, containing the Covenants and Agreements relating to the Service of Such Clerks or Apprentices the full Sum or Sums of Money received, or in any wife directly or indi-rectly Given, Paid, Agreed or Contracted for; All such Masters and Mistresses are Acquitted and Discharged of Majeers and Mijrejjes are Acquitted and Dijenarged of and from all Penalties incurred by fuch Omissions, upom Payment of the said Duties on or before the Twenty Ninth Day of September, 1724. And for preventing the like Omissions for the future, the said Commissioners do hereby further give Notice, That the Times limited by the Act of Parliament, which grants the said Duties and National Research. Dates of fuch Indentures or Contracts as are executed within the Limits of the Bills of Mortality, and TWO MONTHS after the Dates of fuch Indentures or Contracts as are executed within the Limits of the Bills of Mortality, and TWO MONTHS after the Dates of fuch Indentures or Contracts as are executed elsewhere throughout the Kingtracts as are executed elsewhere throughout the Kingdom of Great Britain; and that on Neglect of Payment
