Madrid, July 31, N. S.

ON the 27th Instant the Marquess de Monteleon set out from hence for Paris. King Lewis has appointed the said Marquess's Son, who married the Count de Guldenstein's Daughter, to be his Majesty's Envoy at Copentagen and Hambourg. The Marquess de Risbourg a Flemish Nobleman, Colonel of the Walloon Guards, who was for about ten Years Captain-General of the Kingdom of Galicia, is lately made Captain General of Catalonia, which Employment has been vacant ever since the Death of the late Prince Pio. Yesterday in the Afternoon the Infanta betrothed to the Infant Don Carlos, was confirmed in St. Jerome's Convent in the Buen-Retiro, at which Ceremony their Majesties and the whole Court assisted: Afterwards she received the Compliments of all the Nobility. The new Dey of Algiers having lately sent a Permission to the Religious Order of Fryars for the Redemption of Slaves, to send some of their Order to Algier to redeem as many Christians as they shall think fit; they went Yesterday in a Body, with their Standard, to the Buen-Retiro, being accompanied by many of the Grandees, and made their Compliments to their Majesties and the Infantes, who were in their Balconies to see the Procession pass by; some of them are already set out for Algiers for that Purpose.

Copenhagen, Aug. 5, N. S. The King of Denmark on his Return hither from Aix la Chapelle was for some Days indisposed; but Yesterday his Majesty appeared in Publick, and M. Buys Minister from the States General had his first-private Audience of his Majesty.

Paris, Aug. 11, N. S. On the 4th Instant the Dutchess of Orleans, being accompanied by the Duke her Husband, was introduced to the King at Versailles by the Dutchess Dowager of Orleans, for the first time since she came into France: The 6th his Majesty made a Visit to the Dutchess of Orleans in her own Apartment. The 7th his Majesty made a magnificent Entertainment for the said Dutchess, to which several of the Chief Persons of the Court of both Sexes were invited. The 8th the said Dutchess received the Compliments of the foreign Ministers, on her Marriage. The King's Departure for Fontainebleau is fixed to the 23d Instant.
