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## From Thursday November 30. to Bunday December.4, 1671.

Waymouth, November 29. Efterday arrived here the Pavid of this place, in 17 days from Port O Port, the Master tels us, that a little before his departure from thence, came in where fe-ven English Merchant men from New-foundland, of which, four were of Barnstaple, one

of Topfhim , and one of London, the other belonging to some other of the Western Ports of England.

, Stockholme, Novemb. 7. Here is arrived the Marquis de Vaubrun, being to continue here in quality of Envoy Extraordinary, till the arrival of Monfieur Courtin from France; in the interim Monsheur de Pompone is preparing for his return from this employment, and may be ready to parthence about the later end of the next week.

Ditto, 14. The French Amhaffador Monfieur Courtin, being advanced within fome Leagues of shis place, the French Refident, with feveral other of that Nation, are gone to meet him, and wait upon him hither; it is faid, that Monfieur de Pompone will immediately upon his arrival here . fet forward on his return home, he having received fresh orders from the Court of France to that purpole, We fuddainly expect here a Minister from the Elector of Brandenburgh, he being, as we are cold, already on his way hither.

General Wrangel hath lately fent orders to all Commanders and other Officers imployed in the Service of this Crown, to repair immediately to their respective charges. Our Letters from Musco-wy speak fill of great disorders in the Eastern parts of those Countries, where the Rebellion still keeps footing, to the great hindrance of their Trade and Commerce, and the disturbance of that, and the other Neighbouring Countries.

Leghorne, Novemb. 16. The 14 inftant arrived here the Owen and David, under the Convoy of Captain Beach, who yesterday departed again for Part Mahon, the Omen and David fayling at the fame time in Company of some other Merchant men for England. The Cardinals Chigi and Rospigtiofi, who were lately at Florence, are gone thence on their return to Rome.

Ditto, Novemb. 23. The 19 inftant arrived here the Fohn and Thomas from London; and yesterday the Mary Rofe and Succefs Frigats, with fix Merchant men under their Convoy from Newfoundland ; the Endeavor Merchant man is past by for Venice. By a Barke artived in three days from Callary, we are told, that there had been for feveral dayes . an Argiers Man of Warr on those Coafts, and had taken several Vestels belonging to that place.

Venice, Novemb. 21. We have advice, that the Captain Bassa had in the late bad weather be met with at Sea, lost 5 of bis Galleys, himself being forced into Napoli di Romania ; that he intended from thence, fo foon as his remaining Galleys were refitted, and in a condition, to put to Sea ugain for Candia, where, as our Letters from thence, tell us, the Inhabitants, as well Chriftians as Turks, as likewife the Soldiers, are very much diffatisfied, through the daily oppressions of their Bassa. By

Squadron confilting of Jeven men of War under the Command of Monlieur d' Almerar , keep their Station at prefent about Sapienza, having advice of fome Argiers men of War, that were defigned that way in hopes of purchase.

Procurator Nani is returned hither from Dal-matia, having at his arrival, been welcomed by 20 Guns from the three Galleys, that were then in Port, and received with a general joy, for the happy conclusion of the affair of the Limits; in the management of which, they very much commend the prudent carriage of this Minifter. He hath been fince in the Senate, to give them 2 more particular account of those Transactions, which he did, to their great latisfaction, having had the publick thanks returned to him, in words which might best express the sence they had of the grateful service he had done the Republick on this occasion,

From the Port they write , of the continuance of the troubles in Arabia, which, how light foever the Ministers of that Court would seem to esteem of them, we are certainly told increase dayly, and are come to far, that it must be no small force which shall be able to quel them ; the Grand Signion continues in the mean time at Advianople, leaving the care of the quieting thele dilorders chiefly to the Grand Vifier ; who notwithflanding , he gives out, that the feveral Baffa's in those parts, are sufficient, ly able with the Forces under their Command to meet those diffurbances, yet omits not daily to draw down more towards thole parts.

Vienna, November 21. Wes have had a report here, as if the Turks had lately feifed on a small Town on our Frontiers, becaufethofe Inhabitants refused to pay the Tribute they would have exacted from them, but not having been any way fince confirmed, wee begin to look upon it as a miftake only: Though in the mean time it is advifed from Hungary with much confidence, that the Rebells there are forming fome notable defign, for the diffurbance of the Peace of those Countries, to which they are, as is thought, the more encouraged by the promiled affiftance of Abafti, Prince of Tranfilvania, and the news they have there, that the Grand Visier had totally quelled the disturbances about Mecca; upon which more Forces are daily or, dered to march towards those parts, to be ready to stifle any disorder, which might there happen.

Cologne, Novemb. 27. This day our Magistrates are to give their answer to the Project lately framed by the Deputies of the Circle of Weltphalia, in order to an accommodation , In the interim, we are told, of fome difficultie, which hath, among it other things been made, concerning the time to be allowed for the determining by way of Arbitrage our present differences; and that some feoni much to question, that the Circle of Wessphalia may not be so punctual in furnishing of Money, for the payw ment of the Forces which they offer to have in Gara Veffel arrived here, we are told, that the French rifon here, as our other Allyes have been in pay-

ing constantly from time to time, the Troops that are at prefent here; nor are there wanting those who-openly alleadge several other Reasons, why we ought not to guit the affistance of the States General of the United Provinces, in obliging Colonel Bampfields Regiment to retire from hence-, and fo leave our felves exposed to farther danger and in certainty; amidst these various and interessed difcourfes, we know not what may be done, but must expect till the Declaration of our Magistrates in these matters, shall fully conclude all; the Bishop of wa very Noble and Splendid Dinner; where were Munster continues Itill in these parts, being defi-rous to see the differences wholly accommodated, Court: On Monday was provided a great Treat before his return towards Westphalia.

Ditto, Yesterday was read in a full Assembly of our Magiltrates, the answer to the late Projects, which is this day to be put into the hands of those Deputies; we know as yet nothing farther of the patticulars, though in general, it is faid, that things stand pretty fair for an agreement; and that our Magistrates defire the Emperor may be first acquaiated with what they have in hand, before any thing be concluded; and that they may have good fecurity that the Moneys for paying the Garrilon's which shall be put in here by the Circle of Westphalia, be punctually furnished; but of this, we shall in a day or two have the particulars at large.

Monfieur Verjus the French Minister is returned from Paris', and yesterday went to wait upon the Elector at Breuil, as did likewile the Imperial Commillioners, who have been here for the determining the affair of Hoxter, which is submitted to the Ar bitrago of the Elector of Mayence, and the Duke of Wirtembergh.

Ratisbonne, Novemb. 19. Yefterday'this Dyet being fully affembled, after some debate, agreed on the Instructions framed for the General of the Impepetial Army, the feveral difficulties which had intervened at their former Confultations, concerning this i particular, having been finally overcome through the prudent endeavors of the Bishop of Aichstadt, and several others of the Members of this Dyet; this work being now concluded, their next will be, the making choice of a General, and the reft of the Chief Commanders of the Army, for which feveral Candidates appear, yet without any certainty who will obtain it.

In the mean time we have advice from all parts of the raifing of Men, and other Military preparations; the feveral Imperial Towns, thinking it very necessary in the present conjuncture, to put themfelves into a posture of defence.

Paris, Decemb. 9. The Court continues at St. Germaines, where their Royal Highnesses likewise are receiving daily the Complyments and Congra-tulations of all the publick Minifters, and others the most eminent persons of this Court. Monsieur Verjus is returned again for Cologne, with farther instructions how to steer in the present Negotiation of affairs there.

The King having observed that the West-India Company established here, was unable, through the great loffes they have had, to manage the whole Irade, which by their Patent was committed to them, hath lately by an order of Councel, granted liberty to all his Subjects, to Trade either in particular or in Companies, to any Place or Colonie belonging to the French in America, without paying any allowance or confideration to the faid Company upon that account.

From Rome we expect to hear fuddainly; of a prontotion of Cardinals 5 especially fince there are at present four places vacant in the Sacred Colledge, by which means the feveral pretenders may be at once | faul be well rewarded for their pains.

Antwerp, December 9. Wee have of late had vety various and uncertain reports, concerning the Affairs of Cologne ; which one while feem near concluded, and then on a suddain start so farr back again, that nothing can be expected but a rupture.

It is now faid, That the Emperor is fending thither 8. Regiments of Foot; That the States General of the Vnited Provinces, are likewife drawing down feveral Troops towards those parts, befides three Regiments of German Foot which are to go from hence, all which Forces are to be comman-ded by the Marquis de Grana, for the defence of thaf Town.

Whitehall, Decemb. 3. On Friday last his Excelleucy Don Francisco de Melo, Ambalfador irom the Crown of Portugal, had his publick Audience of their Majesties in the Banqueting House. with the usual Ceremonies; having been conducted from his House at st. fame's, by the Right Honourable the Earl of Manchester, and Sir Charles Cotterel Master of the Ceremonies, in His Majesties Coach, attended with a great Trayn of other Coaches with fix Horfes apiece, after which, he had likewife Audience of his Royal Highness in his own apartment.
