## PRESENT,

The King's most Excellent Majesty in His Privy Council

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament made in the Ninth Ýear of His Majesty's Reign, Entituled, An A& for the more effectual punifhing wicked and evil difposed Perfons going armed in Difguile, and doing Injuries and Violences to the Per-fons and Properties of His Majefty's Subjects, and for the more fpeedy bringing the Offenders to Juffice **a** it is (among other Things) Enacted, That if any Perfon or Perfons, from and after the 1ft Day of June, in the Year of our Lord 1723, being armed withSwords,FireArms or other offensiveWeapons, and having his or their Faces blacked, or being otherwife difguifed, fhould appear in any Forreft, Chafe, Park, Paddock, or Grounds incloied with any Wall, Pale, or other Fence, wherein any Deer had been or fhould be ufually kept, or in any Warren or Place, where Hares or Conies had been or fhould be ufually kept, or in any High Road, open Heath. Common or Down, or fhould unlawfully and willfully hunt, wound, kill, de-ftroy, or fteal any Red or Fallow Deer, or unlaw-fully rob any Warren or Place where Conies or Hares user profiles here or chould unlawfully Hares were ufually kept, or fhould unlawfully fical or take away any Fifh out of any River or Pond ; or if any Perfon or Perfons from and after the faid 1st Day of June, should unlawfully and willfully

wilfully hunt, wound, kill, deftioy, or freal any Red or Fallow Deer, fed or kept in any Places in any of His Majefty's Forrefts, or Chales, which were or thould be inclosed with Pales, Rails, or other Fences, or in any Park, Paddock, or Grounds inclosed, where Deer had been or should be usually kept, or should unlawfully and maliciously break down the Head or Mound of any Tith Pond, whereby the Fifh thould be loft or deftroyed; or thould unlawfully and malicioufly kill, maim, or wound any Cattle, or cut down or otherwife deftroy any Trees planted in any Avenue, or growing in any Garden, Orchard, or Plantation for Ornament, Shelter, or Profit, or fhould fet Fire to any House, Barn, or Outhouse, or to any Hovell, Cock, Mow, or Stack of Corn, Straw, Hay, or Wood, or fhould willfully and malicioufly fhoot at any Perfon in any Dwelling-Houfe or other Place, or fhould knowingly fend any Letter without any Name fubfcribed thereto, or nguese with a fifthious Name, demanding Money, Veni-fon, or other valuable Thing, or fhould forcibly reficue any Perfon, being lawfully in Cuftody of Ofference other Perfon for any of the Offences beforementioned; or if any Person or Per-fons fhould, by Gift or Promife of Money or other Reward, procure any of His Majefly's Subjects to joyn him or them. in any fuch unlawful Act, every Perfon fo offending, being thereof lawfully convicted, thould be adjudged Guilty of Felony, and thould fuffer Death as in Cafes of Felony, without Renefit of Clergy. And of Felony, without Benefit of Clergy. And whereas it is by the faid A& further Enacked, That for the more easy and fpeedy bringing the Offenders againit the faid A& to Juffice, That if any Perfon or Perfons should be char-ged with being Guilty of any of the Offences forefold before any two or more of His Meighe's aforefaid, before any two or more of His Majefly's Juffices of the Peace of the County where fuch Offence or Offences were or fhould be committed, by Information of one or more Credible Perfon or Perfons upon Oath by him or them to be fubfcribed, fuch Justices before whom fuch Information should be made as aforefaid, should forthwith certify under their Hands and Seals, and return fuch Information to one of the princi-pal Secretaries of State of His Majefty, His Heirs or Successors, who is by the faid Act required to lay the fame as foon as conveniently might be before His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in his or their Privy Council; whereupon it fhould and might be lawful for His Majefty. His Heirs or Succeffors, to make His or their Order in His or their faid Privy Council, thereby requiring and commanding fuch Offender or Offenders to fur-render him or themfelves, within the Space of Forty Days to any of His Majefty's Juffices of the Court of King's-Bench, or to any one of His Majefty's Juffices of the Peace, to the End that he or they might be forthcoming to answer the Offence or Offences wh rewith he or they should to fland charged, according to due Course of Law; which Order fhould be printed and pub-lifhed in the next London Gazette, and fhould Forthwith be transmitted to the Sheriff of the County where the Offence should be committed, and should, within fix Days after the Receipt thereof, be proclaimed by him or his Officers between the Hours of Ten in the Morning and Two in the Afternoon in the Market Places, upon the respective Market Days of two Market Towns in the same County near the Place where such Offences should have been committed, and a true Copy of such Order should be affixed upon fome publick Place in fuch Market Towns; and in cafe fuch Offender or Offenders flould not furrender him or themfelves, purfuant to fuch Order of His Majefty. His Heirs or Succeffors, to be made in Council as aforefaid, he or they to neglecting or fefuling to furrender him of

themfelves as aforefaid, fhould, from the Day ap-pointed for his or their Surrender, as aforefaid, be adjudged, deemed, and taken to be convicted Death as in cafe of a Perfor convicted and at-tained by Verdict and Judgment of February without Benefit of Clergy; and that, it should be lawful to and for she Court of Kings-Bench? or the Justices of Oyer and Terminer, or General Goal Delivery for the County where the Offence fhould be fworn in fuch Information to have been committed, upon producing to them fuch Order in Council under the Seal of the faid Council, to award Execution against luch Offender and Ofaward Execution against type Offender and Of-fenders in fuch manner as if he or they had been convicted and attainted in the faid Court of King's-Bench, or before fuch Juffices of Oyer and Terminer or General Goal Delivery refpec-tively, as by the faid Act may more fully ap-pear. And whereas in Purfuance of the Sta-tute in that Cafe made and Provided, the Right Honourable the Lord Viscount Townshead crach Honourable the Lord Vifcount Townshend, one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, did this Day lay before His Majefty in His Privy-Council, the Information of John Ruffell, being a credible Person, taken upon his Oath, the 28th Day of November, One thousand seven hundred James Tichborne and Henry Wyatt, Elgrs, gwo of His Majefty's Juffices of the Peace for the land County of Surry, according to the Rorm of the Statute in that Cafe made and provided. Which faid Information was, by Certificate in Writing under the Hands and Seals of the faid James Tichborne and Henry Wyatt, bearing Date the faid 28th Day of November, certified and by them re-turned to the faid Lord Vifcount Townshend, what is, and was at the Time of making fuch Certific cate and Return, one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, and which Information is in.
