Madrid, Dec. 11, N. S. His Catholick Majesty has consented to the Return of the Queen (King Lewis's Widow) to France: To which end Orders are given for drawing up certain Regulations for the Security of the Payment of her Dowry, and for naming the proper Officers of her Household and her Attendance, with the Formalities that are to be observed on her Journey; which are all to be approved of by the King of Spain. The Marquess de Campo Florido, President of the Council of Finances and Superintendent of the publick Revenues, being dangerously ill; his Catholick Majesty is about to appoint another Person to act as Superintendent during the Illness of the said Marquess, that thereby publick Affairs relating to the Revenue may meet with no Delay. M. Vander Meer, Ambassadour from the States General to this Court, is preparing to make his publick Entry on the 19th Instant, when he is to have an Audience of their Catholick Majesties, of the Prince of Asturias, and of all the Infantes. 'Tis advised from Port Mahon, that Governour Kane was to set out from thence in a few Days for England. From Cartagena we have an Account, that some Fathers of the Order of Mercy for redeeming Captives, arrived there the 17th of last Month from Algiers, with 265 Persons, whose Liberty they had purchased by Money they had collected by charitable Contributions in several Parts of this Kingdom: Among these redeemed Captives were eight Women, and 12 Children the eldest of which was but 12 Years old.

Vienna, Dec. 13, N. S. On the 11th Instant the Archduchess Elizabeth was declared Governess of the Austrian Netherlands: The Resolution of sending thither provisionally Field Marshal Thaur, was also made publick the same Day.

Hague, Dec. 26, N. S. The Consent of the respective Provinces, for sending a new Squadron of six Men of War into the Mediterranean, having been transmitted hither, that Affair was finally concluded on Saturday last.
