Madrid, Dec. 11, N.S. His Catholick Majefty has confented to the Return of the Queen (King Lewis's Widow) to France : To which cod Orders are given for drawing up certain Re-gulations for the Security of the Payment of her Dowry, and for naming the proper Officers of her Houshold and her Attendance, with the Formalities that are to be oblerved on her Journey; which are all to be approved of by the King of Spain. The Marquels de Campo Florido, Prefident of the Council of Finances and Superintendant of the publick Revenues, being dangeroufly ill ; his Cathelick Majefty is about to appoint another Perfon to act as Superintendant during the Illnefs of the faid Marquels, that thereby publick Affairs relating to the Revenue may meet with no Delay. M. Vander Meer, Ambaffadour from the States General to this Court, is preparing to make his publick Entry on the 19th Inftant, when he is to have an Audience of their Casholick Majeflies, of the Prince of Aflarias, and of all the Infantes. 'Tis advised from Port Maboo, that Governour Kane was to fet out from thence in a few Days for England. From Cartagena we have an Account, that fome Fathers of the Order of Mercy for redeeming Captives, arrived there the 17th of last Month from Algiers, with 265 Persons, whole Liberty they had purchaled by Money they had collected by charitable Contributions in feveral Parts of this Kingdom : Among thefe redeemed Captives were eight Women, and 12 Children the eldeft of which was but 12 Years old.

Vienna, Dec. 13, N.S. On the 11th Infant the Archdutchels Elizabeth was declared Governels of the Authrian Netherlands : The Refolution of fending thither provisionally Field Marshal Thaun, was also made publick the fame Day.

Hague, Dec. 26, N.S. The Coolent of the respective Provinces, for sending a new Squadron of fix Men of War into the Mediterranean, having been transmitted bither, that Affair was finally concluded on Saturday laft.
