St. James's, December 26.

ON the 22d Instant in the Evening the young Princess was Christened at Leicester-House, by the Name of Louisa, there being present their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales, Prince William, the Princesses, the Princess Amelia standing God-mother, the Dutchess of Richmond Proxy for the Princess Louisa the other God-mother, and the Earl of Grantham Proxy for the Prince Royal of Prussia Godfather; the Service was performed by the Reverend Mr. Dean Harris.

On Christmas-Day His Majesty, with his Royal Highness the Prince of Wales and several of the Nobility, received the Holy Sacrament in the Royal Chapel at St. James's, the Communion-Office being performed by the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of London, Dean of the Chapel, and the Sermon preached by the most Reverend the Lord Archbishop of York, Lord Almoner.
