On the 3d Instant died the Count do Altamira, the Fever which came upon him after the cutting off of his Leg being succeeded by Convulsions: His Place of Lord Chamberlain was immediately conferred on the Marquels de Valero, President of the Council of the Indies.
On the 6th Instant their Catholick Majesties went to the Pardo, where they will remain till the 14th of the next Month: Besides the Marquess de Grimaldo who is gone thither, Sig. Orendayn went also by his Majesty's Order. They write from Cadiz, that the two Spanish Men of War, the Oneto and the Brandon, which were forced back by Stress of Weather, are resitting in the said Port, and will be ready to set Sail for the West-Indies in about 15 Days.
