Madrid, May 28, W. S. On the 18th Instant the King being at Aranjuez received Advice by a Courier from Vierna, who came by the Way of Genoa, that a Treaty of Peace between his Catholick Majesty and the Emperour was signed the 30th of April: Whereupon an Express was disparched hither to the President of Castile, with Order to publish the News and to proclaim the Peace; which was accordingly done the same Night, with great Solemnity, to the inexpressible Joy of all People, who made the greatest Illuminations and Bonfires that have been feen on any Occasion, which they continued the two following Nights. On the 26th Sig. Lawles the late Spanish Ambassadour at the Court of France arrived here, and the next Day fet out for Aranjuez, where the Marquess-de Monteleon is also arrived. This Morning their Catholick Majesties set out from Aranjuez for Guadalaxara, where the Infanta is Aranjuez 101 dening. to arrive this Evening.

At Night there were Bonfires and Illuminations, a Play was acted by his Excellency's Order for the Entertainment of the Ladies, and afterwards there was a Ball at the Castle.
