Madrid, May 28, N. S. On the 18th Instant the King being at Aranjuez received Advice by a Courier from Vienna, who came by the Way of Genoa, that a Treaty of Peace between his Catholick Majesty and the Emperour was signed the 30th of April: Whereupon an Express was dispatched hither to the President of Castile, with Order to publish the News and to proclaim the Peace; which was accordingly done the same Night, with great Solemnity, to the inexpressible Joy of all People, who made the greatest Illuminations and Bonfires that have been seen on any Occasion, which they continued the two following Nights. On the 26th Sig. Lawles the late Spanish Ambassadour at the Court of France arrived here, and the next Day set out for Aranjuez, where the Marquess de Monteleon is also arrived. This Morning their Catholick Majesties set out from Aranjuez for Guadalaxara, where the Infanta is to arrive this Evening.

Paris, June 8, N. S. On the 27th past the King declared, that his Marriage with the Princess Mary Daughter of King Stanislaus, was agreed upon. The Marquess de Beauveau is to set out in a few Days for Wissembourg, with the Character of Ambassadour to King Stanislaus who resides there; and is to carry with him the Marriage-Contract, with Power to sign it on the Part of his most Christian Majesty.

Dublin, May 29 Yesterday being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Birth-Day, the same was observed here with great Solemnity; at Noon there

was a numerous Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction to Compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant at the Castle, where there was a Song upon this Occasion as usual: After which there was a sumptuous Entertainment at the Tholfe, where his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant was present. The great Guns from the Barracks at the same time fired several Rounds, and were answered by Volleys from the Regiments drawn out upon Oxmantown Green. At Night there were Bonfires and Illuminations, a Play was acted by his Excellency's Order for the Entertainment of the Ladies, and afterwards there was a Ball at the Castle.

Whitehall, June 4. Yesterday about Ten in the Morning the King set out from St. James's for Hanover. About Noon His Majesty went on board the Carolina Yacht at Greewich, there being then very little Wind and that contrary. The Yachts fell down, with the Tides, to Gravesend; and this Day in the Afternoon, the Wind changing, His Majesty sailed from thence with a favourable Gale for Holland.
