A DECLARATION.

CARTERET,

WHEREAS upon Viewing the last Muster taken of His Majesty's Army in this Kingdom, it appeared to Us, That divers Officers have taken Liberty, at their own Pleasure, to leave the Places wherein they are Garrisoned or Posted, without Licence from the Government; and many others who did obtain Licence do stay from their Duty beyond the Time allowed them, to the Detriment of His Majesty's Service, and contrary to all good Order and Discipline. For Prevention therefore of so great Neglect of Duty, and the Inconveniencies that may happen thereupon, We have thought fit hereby to Require and Command all Officers and Soldiers, now absent without Licence, immediately to repair to their respective Garrisons or Quarters, and there remain at their Duty; and all such as are absent by Licence, to return at the Expiration of such Licences, to their several Garrisons or Posts where they are to continue. And for the future, no Officer is, upon any Pretence whatsoever, to absent himself from his Garrison or Quarter, without special Licence in Writing first obtained from Us, otherwise they must expect to be answerable for their Disobedience.

Given at His Majesty's Castle of Dublin the Twenty Eighth Day of June 1725.

Madrid, July 2, N S. The Marques de Castellar Secretary at War continues to attend his Catholick Majesty at St. Ildefonso. The Marques de la Paz Secretary of the Finances is gone likewise thither, though not entirely recovered of his late Indisposition. By an Ex-

press from Rome we have Advice, that the Pope has conferred the Dignity of Cardinal on Sig. Giudice Brother to the Prince of Cellamare, who is Master of the Horse to the Queen of Spain, and the said Prince has been at St. Ildefonso to notify it to his Catholick Majesty, who expressed much Satisfaction at the Nomination of the said Cardinal. On the 29th past died the Duke of Escalona, in the 75th Year of his Age, after a few Days Indisposition. He was Lord High Steward to the King of Spain, and had served this Crown in the last War as Viceroy of Naples, when it was taken by the Emperour's Forces; he is succeeded in his Estate by the Count de St. Estevan Gormaz his eldest Son, who is Captain of the Spanish Troop of Horse-Guards. Father Morin a Jesuite, the late King Lewis's Confessor, and Confessor to the present Prince of Asturias, being Dead; Father Bermudas his Catholick Majesty's Confessor is appointed to be the said Prince's Confessor in his Room.
