Their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Council.

It was this Day ordered by their Excellencies the Lords Justices in Council, that the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the 12th of this Instant August, should be further prorogued to Thursday the 30th Day of September next.

Madrid, July 30, N. S. On the 17th Instant arrived a Courier from Cadiz with Advice, that on the 15th Instant failed out of that Port with a favourable Wind, the Flota for New-Spain under the Command of Don Antonio Serrano. The same Day another Courier arrived from Barcelona, with an Account that the Marquess de Mari with his Squadron was come into that Port. On the 28th their Catholick Majesties came hither from St. Ildefonso with the whole Court; they will stay here till the 3d of the next Month; and then they go to the Escurial. Yesterday all the Councils and Tribunals went to the Palace and congratulated their Majesties upon the Ratification of the late Peace concluded between the Emperour and Spain, and afterwards had the Honour to kiss their Majesties Hands. This Day their Catholick Majesties and the whole Court assisted at the Bull-Feast, which was performed in the Plaza Mayor with great Pomp and Solemnity, and in the best Order; four Gentlemen on Horseback finely dressed according to the ancient Spanish Custom, fought some of the Bulls, and many others on Foot did the like, and about 20 Bulls were killed. It is said their Catholick Majesties will take a Tour in September next through Arragon, Catalonia, and Valencia, and that his Majesty will in that Journey grant some Privileges to the Inhabitants of those Countries.
