(AMENDMENT NO. 4) TRAFFIC ORDER 2024

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Bexley have on 4 March 2024 made the above titled Traffic Order under Sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The general effect of the above-mentioned Amendment Orders would be to amend the Bexley (Falconwood Station) (Parking Places) Traffic Order 2018: -

- Remove the existing Resident Permit Parking Bay in front of No. 77 Lingfield Crescent.
- The parking bay which currently operates between 10.00am and 11.00pm, Monday to Friday will be replaced with a single yellow line restriction of '10.00am and 11.00pm Monday to Friday'.
- There is a loss of a single parking place

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Enfield (the Council) have made the Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No. 245) Order 2024 and the Enfield (Residents Parking Places) (Winchmore Hill) (No. 1) Traffic Order 2024 under sections 6, 45, 46 and 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

2. The general effect of the Orders which will come into operation on 25 March 2024 will be to introduce new waiting restrictions that operate:

(i) 'At any time' in:-

- (a) Dujardin Mews EN3, at the cul-de-sac end of the road;
- (b) Hunting Gate Close EN2, both sides from its junction with Slades Rise north-eastwards for 7 metres;
- (c) Roedean Close EN3, both sides from its junction with Roedean Road. North side, eastwards for approx. 28 metres and south side, eastwards for approx. 16 metres;
- (d) Roedean Avenue EN3, east side, at its junction with Roedean Close;
- (e) Windmill Hill, north side, west of its junction with Chase Court Gardens, additional 'At any time' restrictions on north side;
- (f) Woodland Way N21, east side, south of the junction with Downes Court;
- (g) Woodcroft N21, both sides at its junction with Woodland Way;
- (ii) Monday to Friday 10.30am to 11.30am' in sections of Woodland Way south of the junction with Downes Court.

3. The general effect of the Residents Parking Places Traffic Order will be to revoke a resident parking place in Woodlands Way.
