Venice; Fanuary 8. Here hath happened this week feveral accidents of Fire, in divers parts of this City, which though happily quenched y did how! ever very considerable dammage. Our Letters from Zant tell us, that Cavalier Quirini, who went hence in September last, in quality of Ambassador to the Port, had arrived at Tenedos in a very weak condition, on his way to Constantinople, and that he is fince dead there; but fince the Senare hath had no particular advice of it, we suspend our belief, till we hear farther; the fame Letters likewise add, that the diforders in Afia are not as yet quite appealed s but feem however, to inconfiderable, as not to give the Grand Signior any great trouble. The Confairs of Barbary's have of late very much infested these Seas, though the Mattefer with other Christian Galleys, continue to do them much dammage, har ving yery lately taken two Vessels belonging to the faid Corfairs, very richly laden, as they were pal-fing from Barbary to Candia.

The Consuls whom the Republick sent the fail year to Soria, Tripeli, Sidon, and Aleppo, have made very profperous Voyages, fo that they have here great hopes of a flourishing Trade in those

Livenburgh, January 11. Brussels, January 17. Yesterday went hence Count Maroin, by order of his Excellency the Conne de Monterey towards Gelderland, to visit our Fortifications in those parts. The Marquis del Fresno, de- fent. figned Ambassador to His Majesty of Great Brit-taine, is still here, being as is said, to expect the arrival of the Deputies of the States General, to know what their Errand may be, before he begin his

journey for England.

From Luxemburgh we have advice, of 4000 French Foot and 2000 Horse, that had passed through those Territories, on their march towards Treves, from whence they are, as is said, to proceed for Bon, Nuis, &c. and that Monsieur de Louvey, had fent before to delire free passage for them. The great preparations that are making in France, daily more and more startle us, though after all, we seem to promise our selves an unconcern at them.

Hague, Fanuary 19. Yesterday his Highness the Prince of Orange, returned hither from Utrecht; and this evening we likewise expect here the Velt-Marshal Wurze. Yesterday the States of Holland Marshal Wurtz. were assembled the whole day, and then debated several matters of great importance, of which, the particulars are not yet certainly known. We cannot but wonder, that we as yet hear nothing farther, concerning the distributing the Commissions for the new Leavies, and the more, feeing it is reported, that they may be yet deferred for some time,

We are told, of an Extraordinary Amhassader the States General are thinking to send to His Majesty of Great Brittaine; and that Monsieur Beverning, or van Beuningen, may be the person designed for that employment, the Heeren Rumaert van Putten, and Vrybergen, together with the Rhyngraue, are now ready for their departure for Bruffels, whither they will certainly begin their journey to morrow

seemed nor at all satisfied with it; the rest of the Provinces defiring, the Command of Admiral might be annexed to that of Captain General, and that both might be conferred on his Highness during life, or at least until farther order; in the mean time the respective Deputies, have sent to acquaint their feveral Principals, with what the States of Hol-land have done herein, whose fresolutions thereupon we may fuddainly expect will be returned hither, and so this affair finally concluded; though many are of opinion, that some of the Provinces will make difficulty to agree with that of Holland, in the point of time.

It is now discoursed, that instead of raising the new Troops, we shall receive into our Service, several Forreign Forces from some of our Neighbours, who have offered to serve this State, with several Regiments both of Horse and Foot. On Munday last the Spanish Envoy here, received, as is said, farther orders from the Court at Madrid, to perfect the Treaty at present on Foot, between that Crown and this State. The Deputies of the States of Hot-land, have daily conferences with the Councel of State, concerning the Military affairs, where the Prince of Orange was yesterday and this day pre-

Here is at present an Envoy from the Duke of Curland, and is, as we are told, treating with the States, concerning that Dukes sending two Regrments into the Service of this State, under the Command of the Prince his eldest Son. We hear not as yet, of any answer the States have returned to the Memorial given in by his Excellncy the English Ambassador, in which it is faid, he demands satisfaction for van Ghents having refuled to

strike this last Summer to the Merlin. Paris, Fanuary 23. We are told of a Treaty com-cluded by Monsieur de Louvdy with the Elector of Treves, by which his Electoral Highness promifes to continue Neuter, and to give free passage to such Troops, as his most Christian Majesty shall have occasion to pass through his Territories, &c. From Meta they write, of 12000 Men that had marched in three feveral Bodies from thence, towards the Electorate of Cologne, and were upon their arrival there, to be quartered in Nuis, Bon, Keyserwaert, and Lin. At Liege great quantities of Corn and other Grain, have been of late provided for the use of his Majesties Troops.

From Theonville they tell us, of the 14 instant, that there had some days before passed near that place 2000 Horse, on their march towards the Territories of Cologne; and that they daily expected 2000 Swiders, together with other Troops, who were to take the fame way. Monfieur l'Estrade, hath been some days since to visit the Dutch Ambassador here, by order from the King, what his Errand was, is not certainly faid, though we fince hear, that the faid Ambassador despairing of being able to effect any thing, in order to the refetling matters, between his Majesty and the States his Masters, is preparing for his return home.
