Trier, January 12. The French Army is at prefent on its march, being divided into four squadrons under the Command of the Marchal de Crequi, and sake their way through these Countreys towards the Electorate of Colugne, where they defigne to be the 20 instant; it is faid they are at present but 7000 strong, of which 2000 onely are Foot and the rest Horse. We are told that the Mareshal de Crequi hath desired of our Elector that these Troops might continue for some short time in his Territories, but that his Electoral Highness had answered, that he could not do it without a notable prejudice to his own intered, all that he could well doe being to grant them passage.

Hamburgh, Jan. 19. Here is appointed a meeting of the Deputies of several Princes, upon what account is not certainly said, though as is generally thought, it is son the making a League of mutual desence between the said Princes; the Deputies of the Electors of Saxony and Brandenburgh, and of the Dukes of Lunenburgh and Saxeh Lawenburgh are already arrived, those from Sweden being like-wife daily expected, so that this Assembly may now

be begun very fuddenly.

From Stockholme they write, that they had ordered 16000 men to be transported to Pomeren and other their Territories in Germany; and that the Heer Van Haren, Ambassador from the States General of the United Provinces was arrived within 14

Leagues of that place.

Calogne, Jan. 19. The 15 instant the Marquis de Louvoy arrived at Bon, from whence he went the next day for Nue, to vilit as well the Fortifications as the Magazines there; it is said he will continue in these parts till the arrival of the French Troops, which we hear are on their march from

Mery towards these Territories, they consist as we are told of 4000 Horle and 8000 Foot, and are upon their entring into their Quarters in thele Countreys, to take the Oath of Fidelity to the Elector.

Colonel Bampfield hath some days since presented a Letter to these Magnirates from the States General on the occasion of the accommodation concluded between their Elector and them; having at the same time declared that he had received Orders from the said States to march out with his Regiment so soon as they should direct, Here hath been a strong report for several days about. The French Troops come down apace into these parts, Nun and Bon being already, filled with them.

It is said that our Elector will goe and pass the

approaching Spring at Munchun, leaving the Courmand of his Fixces to the Duke of Lunemburgh. O Yesterday arrived 2000 French Horse within a League of Nun, where having lodged that night, they this day continued their march, it being said they are to he followed very fuddainly by a body of 16006 men; Several Companies of his most Christian Mazi jesties Life-Guards are likewise arrived in these parts, this morning several of the Officers came hither, with intentions as is faid, to take Lodgings here for fome short tite.

From Francfort they write, that those Magistrates had given out Commissions for the raising of men

Bruffels, Junuary 19.
